

Mitchell on add-on solar systems for domestic hot water and Wray Gibson on solar heating for swimming pools. While solar home heating is still a few years away for most people, add-on solar systems are both available and relatively inexpensive.

Georgetown resident John Mitchell is an engineer who has designed and built his own solar hot water system. Built for less than \$750, his system produces up to 90 per cent of the hot water needs of his family of three.

Wray Gibson, also of Georgetown, is a master electrician and part-owner of Halton Solar Structures Ltd. His company supplies and installs solar pool heating
