
NEW C.O. OF THE LORNE SCOTS Lt.-Col. L. C. Breckon addresses the regiment as he assumes command Sunday.



Once again, I want to report to your readers on the success of the Caribbean Hearing Aid Program co-ordinated by the Ontario Ministry of Education.

During 1977, Dr. Donald Hood, Audiologist, and Mrs. Hood, a Speech Therapist, visited St. Vincent in the West Indies where they did follow-up work on children previously fitted with hearing aids; conducted tests and fitted aids for other deaf children.

At this time, 65 children have been fitted with hearing alds donated to this program by Canadians from coast to coast. And, like all successful on-going and voluntary programs we are again in need of discarded hearing aids.

Anyone with a hearing aid, in any condition, is invited to support this small but productive effort to help the deal children in St.


