A policy requiring contributions of \$25 per foot based on the frontage or properties could be the determing factor deciding whether or not a golf course and country club is built in Milton.

Milton Mayor Don Gordon brought the matter before the regional public works committee Wednesday. He sald the reconstruction contribution called for \$25 a foot for any development along a reglonal road.

Gordon noted that golf courses would have frontages in excess of 2,000 feet and he asked the committee to determine whether or not golf courses would be subjected to

the contribution policy.


