Regional chairman piloted crash plane

Air Canada officials have confirmed that Air Canada captain and Georgetown resident Ric Morrow had piloted the ill-fated DC-9 on a flight from Ottawa to Toronto, one hour prior to the crash of the plane Monday in Toronto.

Mr. Morrow is Halton's Regional Chairman.

The crash, killing two people, originated in Ottawa and was on its way from Toronto to Winnipeg and Vancouver. It never left the ground, but skidded past the end of the 10,500 foot Runway 23 Left and down a 60 foot embankment.

The plane was estimated to be travelling between 160 and 170 miles an hour when it went out of control, airport officials said. Mechanical failure is suspected.

Aboard the crash plane was Richard Begin, a Milton resident and Air Canada steward. Mr. Begin escaped from the crash with only a sprained ankle.

Both Mr. Morrow and Mr. Begin were unable to comment on the crash, on the request of investigating officials.

Also on the crash flight from the Halton area were W. Mang from Oakville, G. Watt from Burlington and A. Tulloch from Oakville.



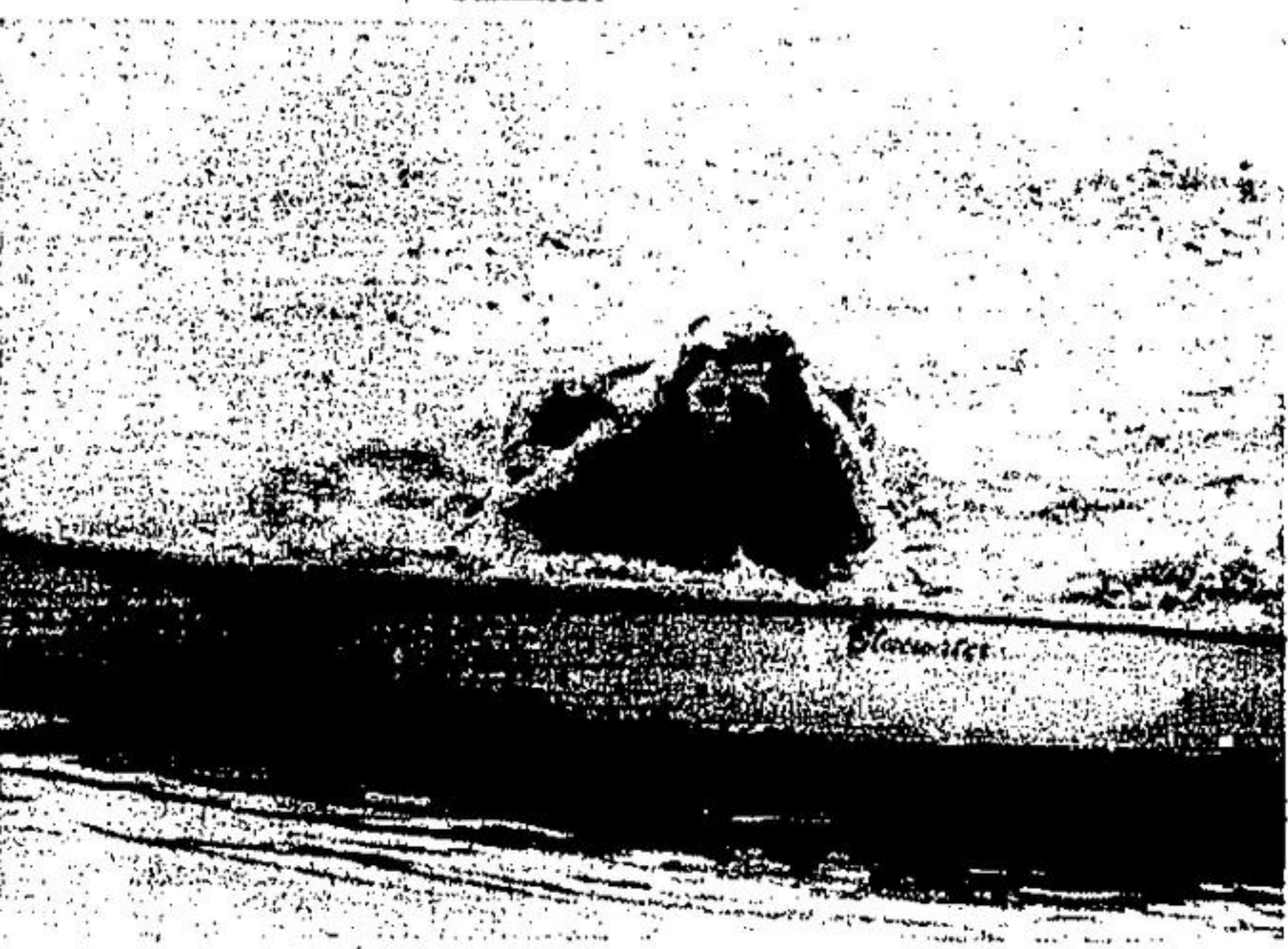
