### Rabies warning Avoid wild animals

According to J. H. Chamberlain, medical officer for the Unit, there have been several reported recent cases: of rabies in Halton region.

Dr. Chamberlain described rabies as a year-round problem and stated that during the summer, cases arise because more people are out in the bush area and in contact with wild animals.

He sald there have been ho reports of individuals receiving bites from rabld animals, but added that the Health Unit has received reports of farm animals with possible rabies.

There are no statistics at this time to determine how many proven cases there have been this far, he said, but the annual report for 1977 shows 31 proven rabies cases from more than 300 investigated cases.

Last year's figure is nearly double the number of prover cases for 1976. In 1978, 33: cases were investigated, with 17 animals found rabid.

Dr. Chamberlain sald rabid animals are usually found in the north Halton area, where a large amount of wildlife can

be found. Rabies is a disease which attacks the brain, and has' varying effects on animals
