

GIFL names all-stars for Sunday's game

Harley Motors' third baseman Ray Inglis came within five votes of being an unanimous selection to this year's Georgetown Industrial Fastball League all-star team.

Inglis polled 50 out of a possible 55 votes to make the league's 1st all-star team for the second time. Last year, while playing for DRG Stationery, he was chosen the best shortstop in the GIFL.

Pitcher Terry Haines of Rexway Towing and catcher Bob Inglis of Harley Motors were also near unanimous choices for the 1st team. Haines received 49 votes to make the dream team for the first time, while Inglis was a runaway winner for the catcher's position with 48 votes. He was also selected all-star catcher last season with DRG Stationery.

Players selected to the 1st and 3rd all-star squads will form Team "A" for this Sunday afternoon's first annual, GIFL All-Star Game at Scotty Patterson Memorial Diamond at 2 p.m. Team "B" will be made up of players named to the 2nd and 4th all-star squads.

Georgetown Chrysler's second sacker, Steve Graham, was the only other player to make the 1st all-star team for the second time. He was also the top choice at second in 1976 when he played for Perk's Barber Shop.

Named to the 1st all-star team for the first time were Jamie Moody of Georgetown Chrysler at 1st base, Larry Peterson of Georgetown Chrysler at shortstop, Gerald Williams of Limehouse in left field, Doug Anderson of Harley Motors in centre field and Hugh Williams of Georgetown Chrysler in right field.

Third all-star team choices, who will dress as alternates for Team "A", are Mike Herrington of Limehouse at 1st base, Bill Kirby of Harley Motors at 2nd, Gord Standbridge of Acton Merchants at shortstop, Phil Dobbin of Rexway Towing at 3rd, Neil Korzack of Georgetown Chrysler in left field, Wayne Farrow of Georgetown Chrysler in centre field, Ron Cole of Hornby in right field, Rob Hatcher of Rexway Towing as catcher, along with Keith McKinnon of Georgetown Chrysler and Norm Topping of Acton as pitchers.

Rookie pitcher Mark Curtis of Hornby and veteran first sacker Blake Inglis of Rexway Towing were the top vote getters on the 2nd all-star team, which will form the

starting lineup for Team "B". Curtis polled 35 votes and Inglis, who made the 1st team last year with Flyers, received 34.

Also named to the 2nd team were second sacker Bob Luffman of Harley Motors and centre fielder Chris Tennant of Limehouse, both 1st team choices in 1977, shortstop Gene Inglis of Park Toyota, third baseman Mike McCandless of Georgetown Chrysler, left fielder Wayne Houle of Royal Trust, right fielder Bill Campbell of Rexway Towing and catcher Rod Puukkala of Park Toyota.

Fourth all-star choices, who will back up the 2nd team on Team "B", are Tim McChesney of Royal Trust at 1st base, Rob Hamilton of Limehouse at 2nd, Bert Osborne of Harley Motors at shortstop, Jim Hall of Royal Trust at 3rd, Doug Barnes of Georgetown Chrysler in left field, Roger Little of Fobert's Flyers in centre field, Blake Shortill of Limehouse in right field, Al Denmore of Georgetown Chrysler at catcher, along with pitchers Joey Deforest of Limehouse and Bob Cunningham of Fobert's Flyers.
