## 900 looking for work Manpower staff busy

With about 900 people registered for work the new counsellor team at Georgetown-Acton Manpower is busy hunting for jobs. Sue Armstrong and Pam Bardswich arrived in Georgetown last month as the new employment counselling team replacing Bernie Tolson and John Fay. Linda Iversen remains as the Manpower Counsellor Assistant.

Limehouse resident and has been with Manpower for a year. The two counsellors said they hope to move to the Georgetown area in the future.

They estimate there are about 900 people on file are unemployed, some have jobs but are looking for work but this is by no means a truly accurate unemployment figure.

While the vast majority of the 900 people on file are unemployed, some have jobs but are looking for work. Others were unemployed but have found work and neglected to inform

Manpower. Some were unemployed, found work and now are again unemployed so their file is reactivated. Still others who are unemployed never bother to contact Manpower.

They have found on the average they are able to place between 10 and 15 people in jobs each week but this isn't putting much of a dent in their files of people looking for work since about 20 new registrations usually come in weekly. At the same time approximately 20 people who were previously registered and then found

jobs return to register again since they are out of work again.

During their brief time in Georgetown the ladies have come to the conclusion some employers and workers in Halton Hills aren't aware of the service they are offering.

The Georgetown office at 7 James Street is open daily Monday to Friday while the ladies take turns running the Acton office on Fridays. Acton's Manpower office is above the Halton Hills Credit Union on Queen Street.

Student Manpower, under the direction of Anita Wildman, is operated out of both the Georgetown and Acton offices. The counsellor is in Georgetown Fridays and Acton Tuesdays and Thursdays.

Manpower in Halton Hills has a listing of close to 30 jobs currently but unfortunately none of their clients are qualified for the skilled positions including welder, truck driver, carpenter, machinist and cost clerk.

Most of the people registered with Manpower here are unskilled with very little work experience and so extremely difficult to place in jobs. There are also some professional and clerical people and Manpower gets few calls for them.

Besides offering Manpower services, including job placement outside Halton Hills in places such as Brampton, unemployment insurance forms are available at the Manpower office as well as social insurance card applications.

### Draft studies

Preliminary draft of the Hazard Land Study prepared by Totten, Sims, Hubicki, Consulting Engineers, has been received by the Credit Valley Conservation Authority. Comments from the Ministry of Natural Resources and the Authority will be considered and incorporated into the final study.

Following site inspections of all potentially hazardous slopes and erosion prone areas along the Credit River and its tributaries, the consultant has prepared data on their locations, the degree of hazard and solutions in dealing with development in these areas.

This study, when completed, will provide the Authority staff with information and assistance in judging what type of development should be allowed and how problems which have already occurred can be solved.

It is also expected that the draft report of the Environmentally Significant Area Study being prepared by Ecologists Ltd. of Kitchener will be in the hands of the Credit Valley Conservation Authority presently.

All available information regarding wetlands, unique forest, plant and wildlife areas have been tabulated. Site inspections across the watershed during the past year have added to this information.

Once approved by the Authority and the Ministry of Natural Resources this study will be used by the planning staff of the Authority in assessing the desirability of particular development in unique areas in the watershed.
