Ms. Creed is in the Acton office Tuesday mornings and at other times when she is needed. She works primarily in Recovery House near Milton.



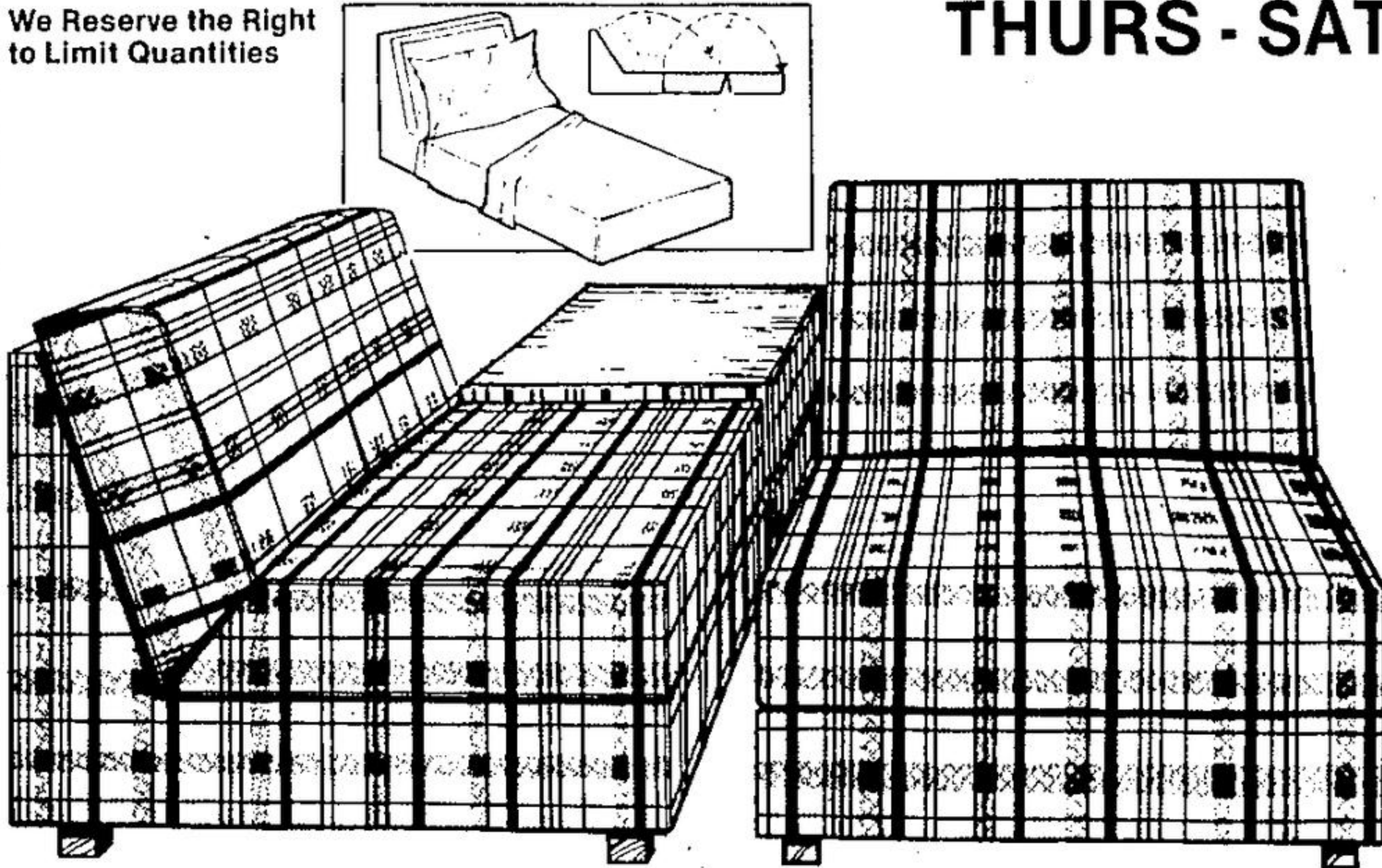

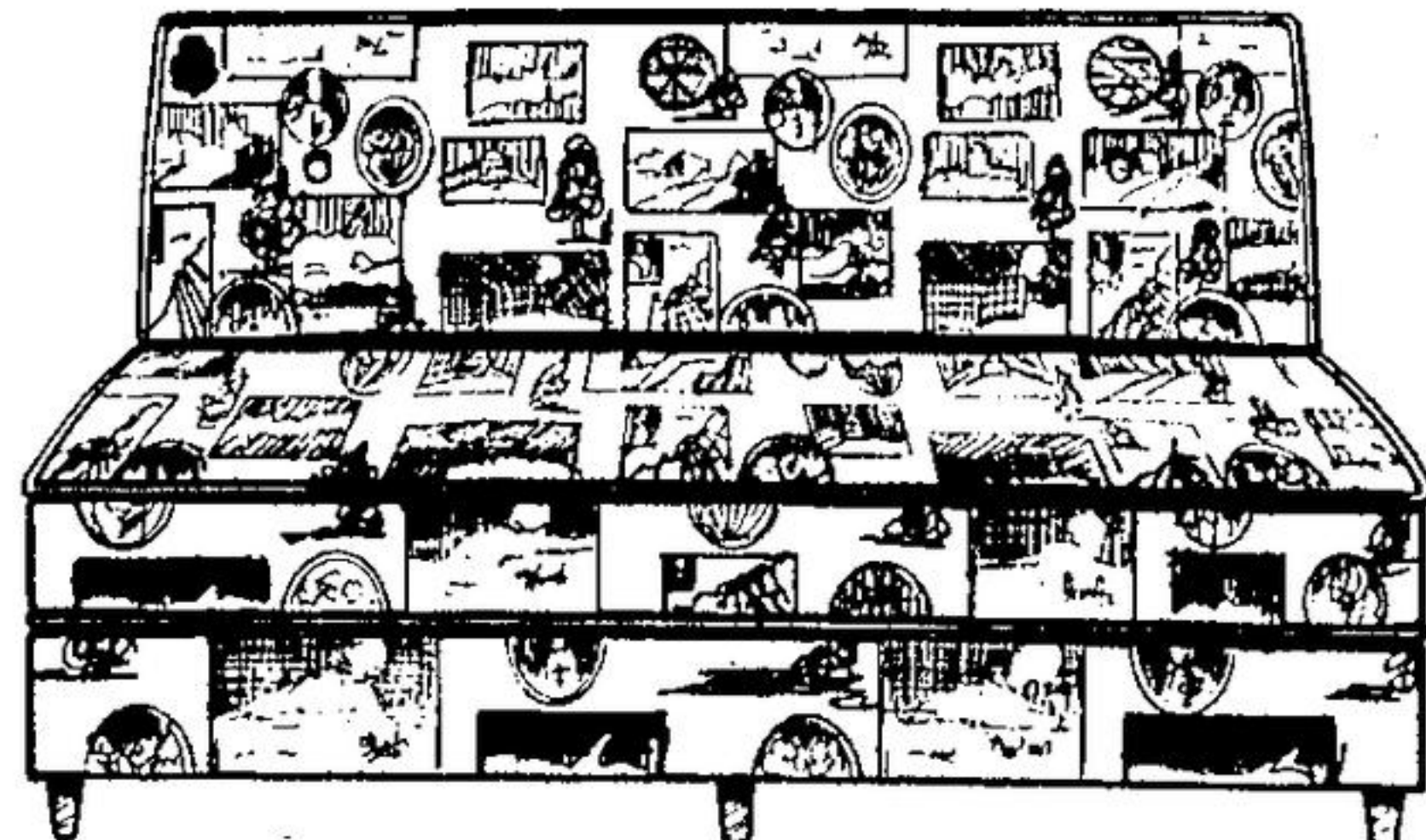
