Vaccinate pet

Before joining the great exodus to Ontario resort areas, make sure the family pet is vaccinated for rabies. Dr. H.J. Neely, of the Ontario Ministry of Agriculture and Food Veterinary Services Branch, says pets should be immunized at least 10 days before you leave for holidays.

"The vaccination should be considered an important safeguard for children and protects the pet from either death or quarantine," he says. Rabies is an infectious disease which affects the nervous system.
