Place in finals at Thunder Bay

An Acton youth has placed in the finals at the Ontario Age Group Swimming Championships held in Thunder Bay July 14 to 16.

Mark Bray, 12-year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. Joe Bray of Elizabeth Dr., took seventh place in the 100 meter butterfly in the finals. He had walked off with fourth place in the 200 meter butterfly finals, but judges later disqualified him because his feet were not in the right position for a few meters. He was however, credited with the time he made.

Mark also placed 12th in the 200 meter freestyle in the overall meet. To make it to the finals, swimmers had to

place eighth or better in the meet. The Acton boy was in the 11 to 12 year old age group. Another Acton swimmer with the same club, John Vadeika, also attended the meet swimming in the 200 freestyle competitions. Although he did not make it to the finals, he is given credit for having been chosen to make the trip. Swimmers had to face stiff competitions at home before being chosen to go to Thunder Bay.

Over 80 clubs attended the meet with over 1,500 swimmers in three categories. Ages were split up: ten and under; 11 and 12, and 13, 14, and 15.

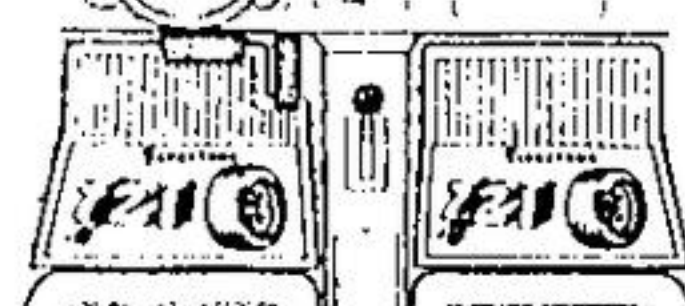

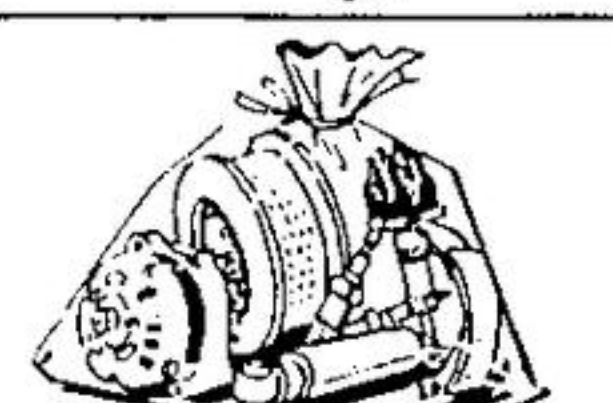

Fast record

The fastest mile ever recorded at any Ontario Jockey Club harness track was put in the history books at Mohawk Raceway in Campbellville at the closing of Grand Circuit Week.

Abercrombie, with Glen Gurnsey at the reins, stormed to a winning time of 1:56.4 in the Queen City Pacing Stakes

and won by two lengths for a record purse of \$78,200.

The horse's record mile was the 12th mile raced in under two minutes during Grand Circuit celebrations at the local track. A watch company awarded a watch to each of the drivers breaking the two minute barrier.
