The couple, still active and outgoing, received a framed apostolic blessing from the late Pope Paul VI, a letter of congratulation from Prime Minister Pierre Trudeau, and a plaque from Premier Bill Davis. The plaque from the premier was presented by MPP Julian Reed, a friend of the family.

The Beeneys were also achighted when they received a phone call from the lady-inwaiting to the Queen, wishing them a happy anniversary.


