Sabres prepare for year Campbell resigns post

Acton Junior 'B' Sabres hockey club is slowly making headway for the 1978-79 season.

After the recent resignation of the coach, Bruce Chapman, last year's manager and secretary Bill Campbell handed in his resignation.

Mr. Campbell, who has been involved with junior hockey in Acton for a number of years cited a big work responsibility as the reason for his resignation.

Mr. Campbell is an insurance adjuster in industrial relations (public relations). He said he has new duties and a larger territory. However, he hopes to help the club in any way he can until such a time as he can see his way clear to return to the club's executive.

Sabres' president Bob Lovell regrets the loss of Campbell but says he hopes he will be able to return soon.

In the meantime Lovell and the Sabres organization have been preparing for the season. They are looking for someone to replace Campbell, who sat with the club as secretary and OHA contact.

Although the use of Peoples Ranch was offered, dryland training for this season may take place at Acton High School which has all the necessary facilities, such as a track and weight room. The school is also more centrally located.

The Sabres are also working on an exhibition season of six to eight games. At present the only set date is September 24 at Elmira. Elmira plays in the Waterloo-Wellington Junior 'B' League. One more date is to be scheduled between the two teams.

A home and home series is still being arranged between Acton and Port Colborne of the peninsula league. The

Sabres have played Port Colborne a pair of exhibition contests in both Acton's two previous years as a junior 'B' club. Last season Port Colborne downed Acton by scores of 10-6 and 7-4. Games against other teams in the exhibition season are still being looked at.

Acton will also have a couple of scouts for the up and coming season. Doug Elliott, who played for last year's Sabres and before then the Streetsville Derbys, will scout the south for Acton. Elliott will do all the scouting from Acton down to the lake shore.

Scouting the north for the Sabres will be the Sabres' first junior 'B' coach Dave McKnight.

Lovell said he would like to see the guys come into training camp in shape for this year as he feels it cuts down on injuries.
