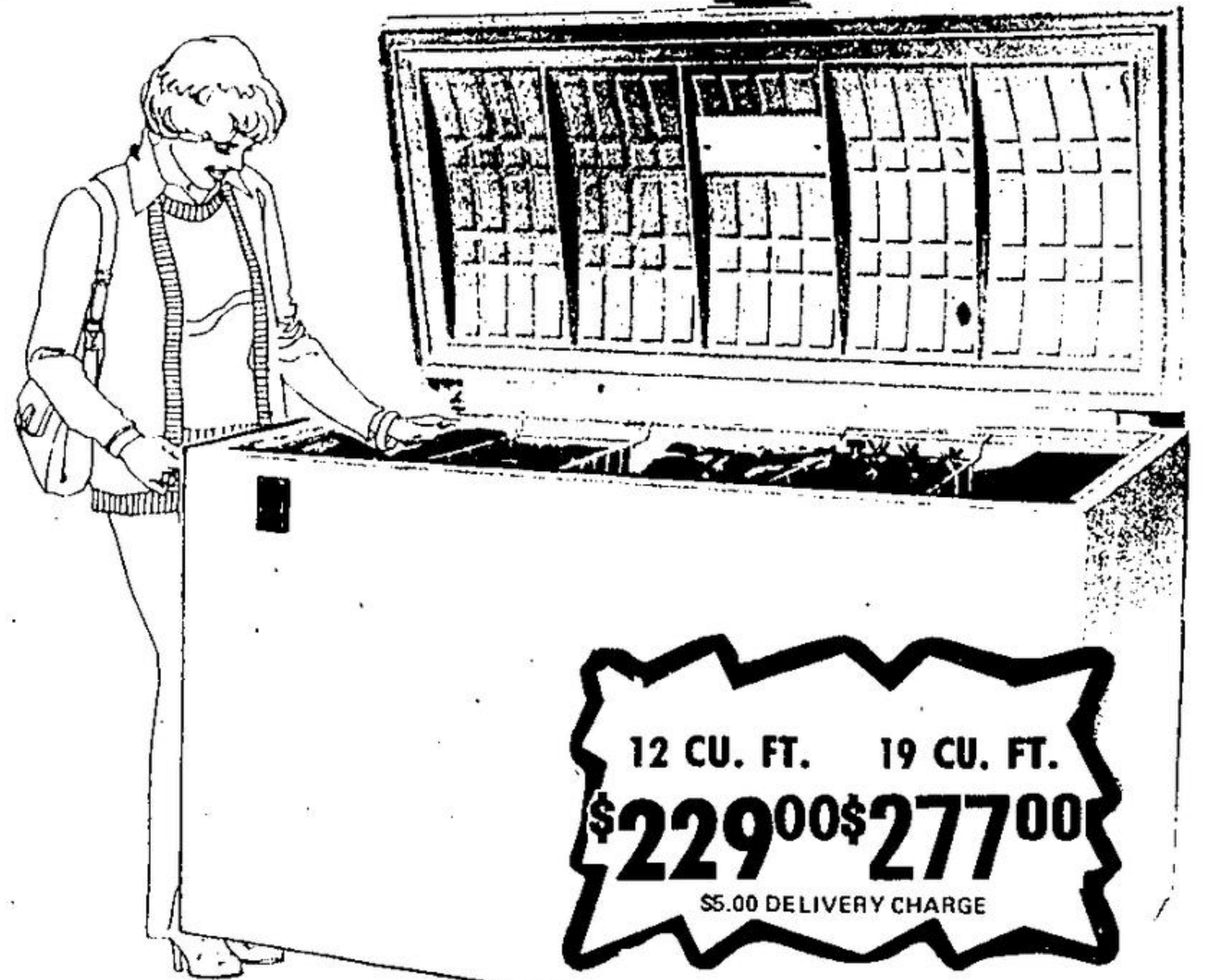

The thresher in use was a White Number Six of uncertain vintage - "at least 30 years old", according to Ken. One of the tractors needed to power the thresher was a 1935 W14 International owned by George Stull.

Stooked grain was transported to the thresher via wagon and team, two willing draft horses, Peggy and Sally, owned by Roland Height of Acton. Forking power was supplied by the guests.
