ACTON FALL FAIR Rules & Regulations

Read carefully rules and regulations, which will be strictly enforced.

1. Stock and produce entered for exhibition must be bonafide property of the exhibitor.
2. Brood mares must have evidence of having bred and suckled their colts at least 2 months; cows must have evidence of produced offspring and given milk for three months; ewes must have evidence of having lambed and been suckled for three months; sows must have been bred from present year.
3. Exhibitors of Pure-bred Stock must produce Registered Certificates of Pedigree if requested. Papers will be checked by someone appointed by the Society.
4. Entries will be limited to one entry in each section, except in livestock and poultry classes where an exhibitor may have the privilege of making as many entries as he chooses in any section, but may not claim more than two prizes in any section. Note special rule in cattle classes. No animal or bird will be allowed to compete in more than one section except as one of a team, herd, pen, or a special.
5. The judges may rule out any animal or article wrongly classed or which they consider undeserving a prize. Directors attending judges are to have Rule 5 strictly enforced. The judges have the discretionary power of withholding or reducing prizes if in their opinion the articles exhibited do not merit them. The judges may also recommend additional awards if they consider them necessary.
6. The Society will take all reasonable precaution to insure the safety of articles on exhibition, but should any article be accidentally injured, lost or stolen the Society will not be responsible for the value thereof.
7. Correct address must be given on each entry form sent in by exhibitor. The Secretary will after the date set forth for paying the prize money viz. October 30th, mail cheques to the post office address as given on the entry forms. Cheques for prize money not presented on or before December 15th, 1978 will not be honoured.
8. At the close of the exhibition, exhibitors must take charge of their exhibits and remove them immediately. No exhibit to be removed from the grounds before 5 o'clock except by permission from the president.
9. Exhibitors are requested to have lists of entries in hands of the Secretary not later than Tuesday, September 12th. Entry tickets will be made out ready to be picked up at the Secretary's office or mailed on request.
10. Stock and all exhibits outside must be on the grounds by 11 o'clock Saturday. In horse classes note time of showing. Hall exhibits and pet stock will be judged Friday afternoon, September 15th. Note: Poultry judging 10.00 a.m. Friday. Entries to be placed between 9.00 a.m. and 11.30 a.m. Poultry Building will be open to receive entries Thursday, September 14th, from 7 - 10 p.m.
11. The sum of \$3.00 shall be deposited with the Secretary in each case of protest or appeal, the same to be forfeited if the appeal is not sustained. Protests or appeals must be entered within twenty-four hours of judging.
12. All exhibitors must be members of the Society before making entries or enclose membership fee of \$2.00 with entry list. (Classes where no membership required excepted.)
