**ENTRIES:** All entries for breeding classes must be post marked not later than September 1st, 1978. The Board of Directors reserve the right to accept entries later than advertised date of closing if deemed advisable.

### RULES:

- (1) Exhibitors of purebred stock must produce registered certificates of pedigree. Pedigrees will be checked by someone appointed by the Society.
- (2) All cattle being exhibited at the show will require a negative test for brucellosis conducted within 60 days of the opening day of the fair EXCEPT:
  - (1) Official brucellosis vaccinates under 24 months of age.
  - (2) Calves under six months of age.
  - (3) Steers and
  - (4) Animals originating from brucellosis-free listed herds.
  - (5) Number of entries per breeding unit for dairy — only one entry per class is eligible from a breeding unit, except the fair may authorize in up to two classes, a maximum of two entries in classes 7-8-9-10-11.
