

Section.

1. Ewe - "Two Tooth" (Two central permanent incisors) - Second pair of permanent incisors may be partially developed. Other two pairs of temporary incisors (milk teeth) must be firmly in place, i.e. a ewe having a second pair of permanent incisors "fully up" is not eligible. Born the property of the exhibitor.
2. Ewe - "Full mouth milk teeth" (all eight temporary incisors). Born the property of the exhibitor.
3. Ram - "Two Tooth" (Two Central permanent incisors) - Second pair of permanent incisors may be partially developed. Other two pairs of temporary incisors ("milk teeth") must be firmly in place, i.e., a ram having a second pair of permanent incisors "fully up" is not eligible.
4. Ram - "Full mouth milk teeth" (All eight temporary incisors). Born the property of the exhibitor.
5. Get of Sire. (Born the property of the exhibitor). A group of three animals, full mouth milk teeth, by the same sire. Both sexes may be represented.
6. Breeder's Herd (bred and owned by exhibitor). A group of 4 animals, both sexes to be represented. Each animal in the group must have been exhibited in one of the classes. All animals in a group to be of one breed.

A suitable trophy will be presented by Cliff Storey, and the Acton Agricultural Society for the Champion pen, any breed. Winner's name will be engraved thereon, and Trophy will remain the property of the exhibitor for one year, then returned to the Secretary of the Fair prior to September 1st, 1979 for competition.

5. No exhibitor may take more than two entries in any one section.
6. No animal eligible to compete in more than one section, except for Championship.

4. Champion Boar. Championship ribbon
5. Sow, born previous to September 1, 1977

9. Market Hogs: Best two market hogs, weight ticket to be shown. (Must be two hogs to an entry. Open to Halton & Peel Hog Producers only). Prize Money: 1st \$40, 2nd \$30, 3rd \$20, 4th \$10. Only one entry per exhibitor.
