

GIFL playoffs start this week

Harley Motors and Georgetown Chryslers were to meet in a sudden victory game, last night (Tuesday), to decide the regular season pennant in the Georgetown Industrial Fastball League.

At the close of the schedule, Harley Motors had 52 points and Chryslers 51, but Harley's had played one more game. Chryslers missed a game against Way-Jay Sportsmen since the Sportsmen were suspended from the league for defaulting four games.

Winner of the game will face 8th place Park Toyota, while the loser takes on 7th place Royal Trust in the first round of the playoffs in best of three series. In the other two best of three quarter-final sets, 3rd place Rexway Towing takes on 6th place Acton Merchants and 4th place Hornby plays Limehouse.

Royal Trust won their final two games over Park Toyota to drop the Toyotas into the 8th and final playoff position. Fobert's Flyers, Way-Jay, DRG Stationery and Glen Williams miss the playoffs.

On the final night of the regular season, Rexway Towing downed Acton Merchants 4-1 to nail down third place and get home game advantage in their playoff series with Acton.

It was the closest regular season pennant race in years. Only nine points separated third place finishers, Rexway Towing, from the last playoff spot holders, Park Toyota.

Harley Motors and Georgetown Chryslers have battled for first place throughout most of the season.
