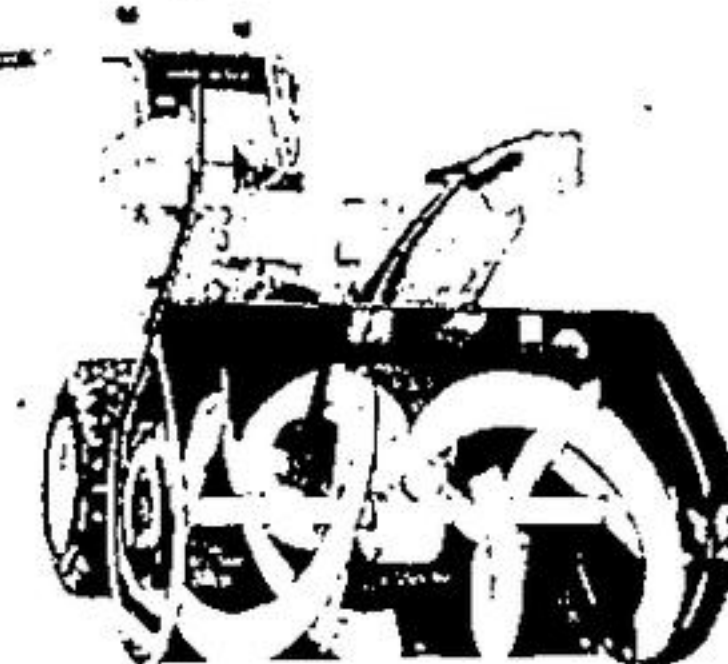

## Terra Cotta Inn opens

Terra Cotta Inn reopened Friday morning after being closed down by Peel Region Health Unit last Tuesday afternoon over the complaints of neighbors that sewage was escaping from the septic tank system.

The Inn is situated on the Credit River.

Heather Walton, manager of the inn, said the problem arose when someone cut the lines to the alarm system which alerts the innkeepers that the septic tank system is overloaded. Ordinarily the inn management informs the company which picks up the tank when the alarm goes off and they replace it before it overflows, she said.

In this case the alarm did not go off and people operating the inn were unaware the septic tank system had overflowed.
