Mrs. George Fleck of Glasgow called in to bid farewell to Mrs. J. and W. Gilbertson before her return trip home to Scotland.

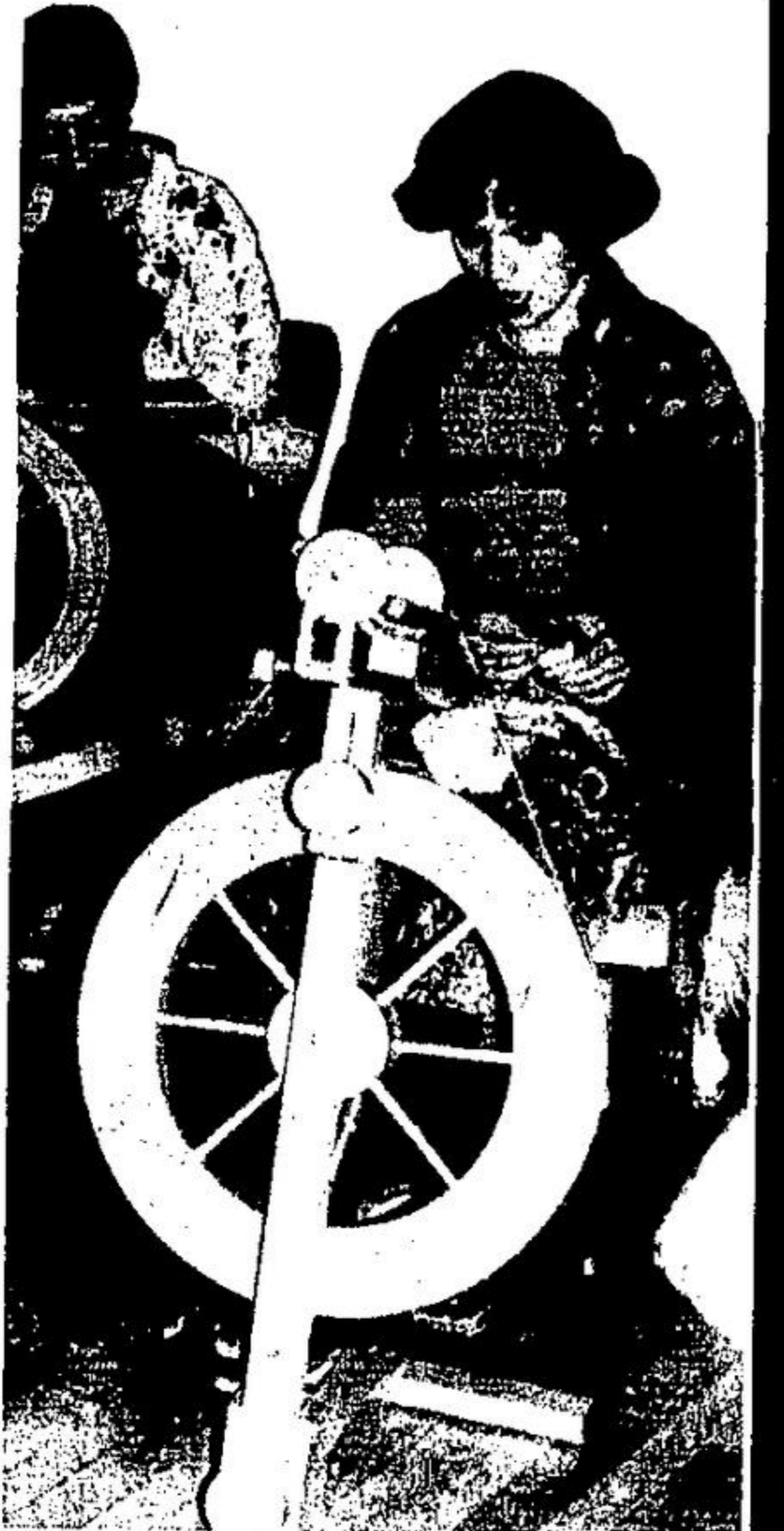
