Non-farmers enjoy matches
You don't have to be a farmer to enjoy the 1978 International Plowing Match and Farm Machinery Show Sept. 28 to 30. This year's match will feature 600 exhibits displaying new farm machinery, 1979 automobiles, building supplies, home appliances, and camp trailers and other recreational items. Located on a 404-hectare site on the Jim Armstrong and neighboring farms, near Wingham, the match will be the largest in its 65-year history.

A highlight of the match was the official opening Tuesday by Professor Neil Armstrong, first man on the moon. Other special events include plowing classes for mayors, wardens and regional chairmen, and media representatives. The Queen of the Furrow will be crowned on Friday. No visit to the match is complete without a look at the plowing competitions. Competitors from Canada, the United States and Europe will plow using oxen, horses and modern equipment. More than 200 contestants will compete for \$35,000 in prize money. The 1978 International Plowing Match and Farm Machinery Show site is located one mile east of Wingham, on Highway 86.
