
Dave Dewdney is a new member of the Acton High School staff who teaches electricity, drafting and wood working. He lives in Mississauga and plans to

Sheridan full-time enrolment is up 7%

Sheridan College totals 6,166, most dramatic increases this representing a seven per cent increase over the previous academic year.

Registrar Elizabeth Craig said as of Sept. 25, 4,415 students were registered in full-time post-secondary programs. Another 1,681 are taking Manpower-sponsored retraining programs and 70 are OCAP students (Ontario Action Career Program).

"First year enrolment in all post-secondary divisions and schools is up significantly" said Craig. "Technology and
