

Inmate work force boon for farmers

Picking apples or cauliflower or working in a mushroom plant may not be the hottest profession, but for over 100 inmates at Maplehurst Correctional Centre, the various jobs have been

well worth the effort. According to one farmer, the Maplehurst inmates are far more preferable to individuals he has employed from Canada Manpower.

"These fellows want to work, and they are good," said the owner of Glengate Farm on Highway 25. "They are healthy and

agile, and I am satisfied. The apple season is nearing its peak, and he has employed over 50 inmates to help with the picking.

Maplehurst is involved in a number of outside work programs, but this summer is a first with the harvest pro-

In co-operation with local farmers, work crews of inmates have been busy having, picking fruits and vegetables and working wherever they were needed.

The idea has worked out well, according to John O'Brien, assistant superintendent of the Centre. He is now hoping to see the program run again next year.

His optimism is matched by several satisfied farmers who have already stated they would like to hire Maplehurst inmates next summer.

Inmates are paid the same wages as any other picker, but must pay from their earnings five dollars a day to Maplehurst for room and For many of the inmates

working at the farms, the job represents an opportunity to establish good working habits and a good work record, explained Mr. O'Brien. Maplehurst's only concern

was that impates would not be taking work away from the community. Thus far, there have been no complaints from the

employers nor the community. For farmers, the inmates represent a stable work force,

continued Mr. O'Brien. "The transient nature of
