Acton capped last week's action off, Sunday, with a 6-4 win over the Milton Flyers. In two games earlier in the week the Sabres provided fans with some exciting third period antics as they rallied from a 5-2 deficit to draw with the Burlington Cougars, 5-5, and in the home opener scored five times in the final frame to earn a 7-7 tie with Dixie. Last week the Sabres opened their season with a 6-3 in Oakville.

Acton, who amassed only 10 points in 42 games last season, has picked up a total of six in four games to date. The Sabres headed into the weekend looking for three wins and very well could have had them if not for some bad luck around the opposition's goal in the dying minutes of the game with Dixie and Burlington.

Acton 5 - Burlington 5
In Burlington, the Cougars

jumped out to a 4-0 lead before Acton got on the board with a power play marker from Mark Schinkel. Glenn Murray and Neil Anderson drew assists. Mark Litton scored two for Burlington, Steve Cricker and John Rae drew singles.

Acton started to skate with the host club in the second period and pulled to within two on the Sabres' second power play marker. Wade Vickery scored the goal, his first of two, with an assist going to Anderson. Burlington extended their lead to three with only 30 seconds left in the period, on a Bryan Grigsby effort.

Wade Vickery started the Sabre rally with his second goal at 2:09 of the third with Mark Schinkel picking up an assist. Schinkel brought the Sabres to within one, three minutes later when he netted the twine from Anderson.

Acton tied the game at the 7:36 mark on their third power play effort. John Elkerton potted the goal with Jeff Shields getting an assist. The two clubs played even over the final thirteen minutes with Acton coming on strong near the end but unable to net the go-ahead marker.

Acton 7 - Dixie 7
Acton fell behind earlier in their home opener as Chris Boucher put the visiting Bee Hives on the sheet at the three minute mark. Acton fought back to tie the score on a Neil Anderson goal. Wade Vickery earned an assist. Paul Salvisburg gave Acton the lead with only one minute left in the period with help from Dave McGilloy.

The roof fell in on the Sabres in the second frame as Dixie counted six straight times and had the Acton fans believing the Sabres of old were back in town.

Determined to make the opener a success the Sabres came out flying. At the 15 second mark Jeff Shields started the comeback with help from Paul Pickard and Glenn Murray. At the 38 second mark Pickard netted an unassisted marker. Paul Salvisburg combined with McGilloy for the second time in the game to pull the Sabres to within two of the Bee Hives.

Jeff Shields scored his second of the period from Murray and Kelly Shaw before Pickard got his second of the frame from Shields to complete the comeback.

Dixie outshot Acton 61 to 57 and took 25 minutes in penalties to the Sabres' 19.
Acton 6 - Milton 4
A three goal performance by Paul Pickard led the Acton attack as they dumped the Milton Flyers 6-4. Milton, who met Streetsville for the league title last season, have

yet to win a game this year. Acton jumped to a 3-0 first period lead on goals by McGilloy, Shields and Pickard's first. Salvisburg, Jamie Ryan, Brad Buchanan and Pickard picked up assists in the first period.

Acton squandered their lead away in the second period as they allowed Marty Vannor to score from Mike Kalapaka at the 1:06 mark. At 2:19 Milton made it 3-2 on the first penalty shot of the season at the Community Centre. Matt Bolger made no mistake putting the puck high over goaltender Rob Bremner's shoulder.

McGilloy gave Acton back their two goal lead at 13:55 with an assist going to Bob Allsop. The two goal lead was shortlived as Paul McCann scored 15 seconds later to keep Milton in the contest.

Acton came out quick in the third period as Pickard rifled

his second goal after just nine seconds of play. Kelly Shaw drew an assist.

Pickard fired his third of the game to give the Sabres a three goal lead, with six minutes remaining. The Flyers never gave up scoring at 15:29, a Greg Roberts tally from Norm Flemington. The Milton club pulled their goaltender over the final minute with the hope of gaining the two goals they needed.

Rob Bremner stopped 55 shots in the Acton net while Gary Hare blocked 45 for Milton. Acton took 25 minutes in penalties. Milton took 47 minutes. In addition to the penalties each team had three players ejected from the game for failing to go to their respective players benches during an altercation.

The Sabres are at home tonight (Wednesday) to the Barrie Colts. Thursday they travel to Barrie and on

Saturday night the Sabres play host to Oak Ridges. Home games begin at 8:30 p.m.
