A contract for the town's supply of winter sand has been awarded to J. C. Duff Ltd. of Limehouse.

The contract calls for a delivered price of \$2.95 per ton for 8,000 tons. Total value of the contract, the lowest of three bids, was \$23,600.

Pete Pomeroy of Norval, candidate for mayor of Halton Hills, is opening up a campaign office in Acton. He and supporters will be available to meet Acton and district people at 5 Main N., which is in the Carpet Cleaners shop behind Family Barber Stylists shop.

The office should be ready by this weekend and will be open for the next three weeks, until election day. There will also be a telephone number to call.

Pomeroy is challenging the present mayor Tom Hill for the post as head of Halton Hills council. He is presently a councillor.

He expects to undertake a door-to-door canvass in Acton and area next week and is getting a letter prepared to distribute to Acton people.

He told the Free Press he particularly wants to keep all the councillors well informed, if he wins the election. He says it will be easier for them to make decisions if the mayor's office becomes the place where information is distributed. He hopes to work closely with all councillors, he said.






