Sacre Coeur, Holy Cross win

Sacre Coeur and Holy Cross schools ran away with the North Halton Separate School cross-country meet last Tuesday in Georgetown. There were 154 participants.

Sacre Coeur, in Georgetown, captured first place in the junior division with 33 points. St. Francis of Assisi, Georgetown, came second and St. Joseph's school, Acton, placed third. St. Peter's school in Milton came fourth while Holy Cross in Georgetown didn't qualify for placing in the junior division, consisting of boys and girls tyke and atom runners, since it didn't field complete teams. Sacre Coeur had 33 points, St. Francis 27, St. Joseph's 13 and St. Peter's 10. Holy Rosary school in Milton wasn't entered.

In the senior division Holy Cross doubled St. Joseph's total of 18 to capture first place. The other three schools had incomplete teams because they don't have pupils who are eligible to run in the boys and girls bantam and midget categories.

Kathy Harris of St. Peter's finished first of 17 competitors in the bantam girls' division. The grade seven student took the lead from the opening gun and finished almost 500 meters ahead of her competitors over the 2200 meter course.

"Kathy is a mature individual with a lot of potential in track events and she helps the younger ones develop the right attitude and technique for the sport," said Fred Demers, cross-country coach at St. Peter's School.

by coach Demers to Jackie Bergin, Bruce Groves, Norman Hubbert, Jeff Bernadine, Michael and Alvin Chuchmach who ran strong races.
