Toy lending libraries said not feasible yet

Toy lending libraries will not be included in the programming of Acton and Georgetown libraries, not yet, anyway.

Children's librarian Sharon Naylor reported on toy libraries at the meeting of Halton Hills library board last Wednesday.

She concluded there was a lack of space and staff to handle such a demanding project, but recommended a budget be established to purchase non-circulating toys and material for use in library programming.

Board members agreed and asked Miss Naylor to look into definite costs. She was also asked to further investigate a specialized toy collection, which would benefit handicapped children and those with learning disabilities.

The non-circulating toy collection would include simple musical instruments, puppets, hats, etc. which would be used in library programs. Her initial recommended budget was \$200 to be financed by the library. Operating costs are minimal, she said.

Miss Naylor had investigated a circulating toy collection, staffed either by library employees or volunteers. In some places families pay a membership fee. Miss Naylor said these programs are very successful as far as the children are concerned, but they take a great deal of time for the staff. Each individual puzzle piece must be marked, for instance, as well as catalogued. There are also repair costs, cost of replacement, furniture and storage costs. Setting up the library could take 175 working hours with 10 hours a week required regularly after that.

All-star line-up

The starting line-up in one of the most exciting hockey spectacles in the history of the game will be decided by the fans.

From early October 1978 until mid-January 1979, hockey buffs across Canada and the United States will, for the first time, become more than armchair selectors as they participate in a ballot to choose the starting line-up for the National Hockey League All-Star team to meet the Soviets in a three-game series in New York, February 8, 10 and 11.

The balloting has been made possible by Wilkinson Sword Canada who, in cooperation with the NHL and NHLPA, will be distributing millions of ballots through all NHL arenas and thousands of supermarkets and retail stores wherever Wilkinson products are sold.

Fans may vote and change their minds as often as they wish.

Each ballot will carry the names of 80 NHL players who have been nominated by a special panel of the Professional Hockey Writers' Association. The players will be listed alphabetically and by position.

There will also be space for write-in nominees, like Bobby Orr, who will be back on the ice this fall.

When the fans have picked the starting line, the remainder of the players will be chosen by the team manager, and/or the coaches of the NHL All-Star team.

The NHL/Soviet series will replace the traditional All-Star Game between the Prince of Wales and Clarence S. Campbell Conference.

Miss Naylor suggested that a circulating toy library could best be handled by a community group or private organization. "I would be more than willing to share my new-found knowledge with them," she reported. "The children's librarian could act in an advisory capacity."

Mrs. Cornwell reported "good financial shape" with the board right on target for expenditures.

Speaking on a special library board meeting to be held soon on goals and objectives, she commented that nobody is happy with simple library circulation reports. It's important to get across what libraries do. We need a way to report effectively. Circulation is dropping off but libraries are busier than ever. We are not doing a good job of measuring and reporting this to the public, she commented. We are competing for dollars in the social field where the cuts are coming.

Board members will be meeting with a representative of the Ministry of Culture and Recreation, Ontario Heritage branch. Some of the staff will be attending sessions of the Ontario Library Association conference in London later this month. Registration fees not over \$250 were approved.

A fee of \$10 was approved for joining the Halton Hills Arts Council. Betty Fisher, the group's treasurer as well as a library board member, pointed out the organization is an umbrella for many groups and she felt the libraries could benefit.

Chairman Dick Howitt said he had been informed by the group which purchased the Chapel St. school in Georgetown that it could be available to the library board. "We'll keep it in mind," he said, and there was no discussion.

Board members agreed to contribute \$150 to the Canadian Library Association, to support Project Progress. The study

will measure libraries' effectiveness. "We need the data," board members agreed.

The possibility of a new door and frame for Georgetown library will be considered. A new door would include safety glass and panic hardware. The present lock doesn't operate properly occasionally and new parts cannot be obtained.

Present were chairman Dick Howitt, members George Lee, Doug Magwood, Ken Riley, Betty Fisher and Walter Behn with chief librarian Betsy Cornwell and children's librarian Sharon Naylor.

The meeting was held Wednesday night of last week in the municipal building.

"Given the limited space of the Georgetown library and the lack of staff at both the Georgetown and Acton libraries, I feel that the implementation of a full-scale toy lending library is not feasible at this time," she concluded.

Although there is space in the Watson room at Acton library, it is needed for other purposes.
