## Dave Whiting in running

Candidate for a Halton Hills area council seat is Dave Whiting of 91 Kingham Rd. Political activity has been banned to him until just recently. As a member of the R.C.M.P. for the past nine and a half years, he was not allowed to seek office. He left the force in August and is now a real estate salesman with Forbert Real Estate. He has been more and more interested and involved in community affairs lately and has decided to seek an area council seat.

He was stationed in western Canada, Ottawa and Toronto and was involved in service clubs and Chambers of Commerce then. He is currently joining Acton Rotary club and has just become a member of the board of directors of the Y.M.C.A.

He and his wife have two children, Leigh, five and Mark, three. "I've always enjoyed politics and think I can do some good on council," Mr. Whiting says.

## Ross Knechtel enters race

Entered in the four-way race for the two area council seats is J. Ross Knechtel, 29 Rosemary Rd. A political newcomer, he is a retired vice-president of Crown Life Insurance Company of Toronto. He and his wife decided to move to Acton before he retired, and have been here five years now.

The Knechtels have three sons, now living in Toronto, Burlington and Moncton, and four grandchildren.

He was born and educated in Toronto. During World War II he became Squadron Leader in the R.C.A.F. and served two and a half years in England and half a year in France.

He was active in Humbercrest United church, Toronto, where he was chairman of the scout group committee and a choir member. He now is a busy member of Trinity United church and sings in the choir here.

If elected, he will have time available to devote to the post of area councillor. However, just as the election nears, he happens to be employed full-

time. He is working for the United Way in Toronto, on behalf of Crown Life, for a two month period which ends Nov. 10. This is the second time he has helped with the organization of the fund-raising drive.

"My basic reason for running," Mr. Knechtel says, "is that I don't think there's enough sensitivity in council to what the people of Acton want."

## Local post workers on the job

Acton's seven inside postal workers are on the job despite Canadian Union of Postal Workers (CUPW) orders to ignore federal back-to-work legislation.

Local post master Gord McKeown said Tuesday the inside workers missed one day last week, Wednesday, because of the national strike. But they and the letter carriers are working "at the moment", Mr. McKeown said.

The 16 inside workers at Georgetown are also on the job as well as the ones at Milton and Oakville. They all obeyed the federal law and returned to work.

Mr. McKeown said the Acton office received mail by truck from Georgetown, Milton and even Guelph. The bulk of the mail from Toronto and Kitchener, is, however, not getting through.

## Fluoridation bill passes

Halton Regional Council passed the by-law to fluoridate water in all parts of the region "except for those parts servicing residents in the Town of Milton."

In a recorded vote, the by-law was passed by a large majority Wednesday, Oct. 18. Milton was excluded from fluoridation after Milton Council and residents expressed opposition. Georgetown, Burlington and Oakville supplies are already fluoridated.

In effect, the by-law allows fluoride to be added to Acton's water supply.
