

THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF ERAMOSA IN THE **COUNTY OF WELLINGTON BY-LAW NO. 24-1978** 

A by-law of the Corporation of the Township of Eramosa in the County of Wellington for the submission to a vote of a question under the provision of The Municipal Elections Act 1977 to the qualified electors in the municipality; WHEREAS at the time of the coming into force of The Ontario Temperance

Act, a by-law dated 1910 was in force within the limits of the municipality prohibiting the sale of liquor by retail therein; AND WHEREAS by Section 50 of Regulation 100/75 under The Liquor Licence Act 1975, the issuance of a liquor licence to premises located in a municipality is confined to those municipalities where an affirmative vote has been taken on the

relevant questions as stated in the Regulations under The Liquor Licence Act; AND WHEREAS under Section 122 of The Municipal Elections Act, the Council of a municipality may submit to a vote of the persons qualified to be entered on the voters' list and to vote at elections in the municipality any question

(or questions) set forth in The Liquor Licence Act 1975; AND WHEREAS the Council considers it expedient and desirable to submit to a vote of the persons qualified to vote thereon as aforesaid the following

question: ARE YOU IN FAVOUR OF THE SALE OF SPIRITS, BEER AND WINE UNDER A

LOUNGE LICENCE FOR CONSUMPTION ON LICENSED PREMISES? AND WHEREAS The Council considers it expedient and desirable that the vote on the question shall be taken upon the day upon which, under The Municipal Elections Act, a poll will be held at the next election of members to Council;

AND WHEREAS it is necessary to provide by by-law for the submission of the said question to the persons qualified to vote thereon and for the taking of their votes thereon:

THEREFORE, the Council of the Corporation of the Township of Eramosa in the County of Wellington enacts as follows:

1. Under The Municipal Elections Act 1977 there is hereby submitted to a vote of the persons qualified to be entered on the voters' list and to vote at elections in the municipality, the following question pursuant to the Regulations under The Liquor Licence Act 1975:

ARE YOU IN FAVOUR OF THE SALE OF SPIRITS, BEER AND WINE UNDER A LOUNGE LICENCE FOR CONSUMPTION ON LICENSED PREMISES?

2. The vote shall be taken upon the day upon which, under The Municipal Elections Act 1977, a poll will be held at the next election of members to Council.
