Morette trial

The trial of Dale Morette for the manslaughter of Lloyd Sedore is expected to end today (Wednesday).

Morette, 25, was charged with manslaughter after the death Sept. 16, 1977 of Sedore, 45, outside the Mill Street entrance of the McGibbon Hotel in Georgetown.

County court judge Patrick LeSage heard testimony in the two and half day trial from pathologists, police officers, patrons of the hotel and an eye witness to the incident alleged to have caused the death of Sedore.

Crown attorney David Price began the case against Morette Monday morning in the county court building in Milton after Morette pleaded not guilty to the charge.

There were 12 witnesses called the first day of the trial. The Crown's first witness was Constable William McGrath, an identification expert who presented a series of photos and sketches and list of the physical evidence that had been gathered.

The rest of the witnesses on

the first day were persons who had been in the McGibbon Hotel beverage room at the time of the incident. Ten of the witnesses were friends and acquaintances of Morette's and the last, Isabell Mary Walter, 54, an eyewitness to the incident.

APPOINTMENT OF VOTING PROXY

Any person whose name is entered on the polling list for a polling subdivision or who has obtained a certificate to be included on the list in the municipality and who is,

- A person other than one who is in a hospital or other institution, where a polling place has been provided on such premises for the purpose of polling or where provision has been made to attend upon such persons for the purpose of receiving their ballot, and
- A person who is certified by a legally qualified medical practitioner, by a certificate filed with the Clerk, to be physically incapable of attending a polling place;
- A person absent from his regular residence by reason of attending an educational institution and expects by reason of such absence from the municipality to be unable to vote at the advance poll or on polling day; or
- A person who expects to be absent from his polling subdivision during the election period including the advance poll and polling day by reason of his being engaged for hire or reward in the business of transportation by railway, air, water or motor vehicle,

may, on forms obtainable at the Office of the Returning Officer, 251 Main Street East, Milton, appoint any person to vote in his stead who is entitled to vote in the same municipality.

Such persons must be appointed and certified by the Clerk of the Municipality during the period following nomination day (Friday, October 23rd, 1978 to 5:00 p.m. on polling day Monday, November 13, 1978.)

NAMES NOT ON POLLING LIST

Any person who has qualified to have his name entered on the polling list during the period of enumeration (September 4, 1978 to September 30, 1978) and finds that his name is not entered thereon or who has not filed the necessary forms to have his name entered during the period for corrections to such list (ending October 27th, 1978) can attend at my office to secure a certificate which will allow his name to be entered at the polling station. Qualified Elector means: a person who during the period of September 4th, 1978 to September 30, 1978 was a Canadian citizen or other British subject, a resident of Milton or a non-resident owner or tenant or a spouse thereof and has attained the age of 18 years by November 13th, 1978.
