

Halton birthday

An historic occasion in the history of Halton Region was reached Wednesday, Oct. 18, when the municipality celebrated its fifth anniversary. Five years ago on that date the first regional council was inaugurated.

Although provincial legislation didn't make the region law until Jan. 1, 1974, the inaugural ceremony marked the end of an era and the beginning of a new one.

Oct. 18, 1973, rang down the curtain on the County of Halton and the seven municipalities which constituted it.

Acton, Burlington, Esquesing, Georgetown, Milton, Nassagaweya and Oakville were replaced by the new communities of Halton Hills, Milton, Burlington and Oakville in the Regional Municipality of Halton.

To celebrate the occasion council decided to present its predecessors, the 1974-76 councillors who first took the reins of regional government in their hands, with rings bearing the coat of arms of Halton Region.

Recipients were Dick Howitt and Ernie Sykes, Halton Hills; Anne MacArthur and Marjorie Powys, Milton; and Gordon Brown, Oakville.

Also honored was Mrs. Ruth Coxie of Halton Hills, whose husband Len represented the rural area from Jan. 1974 to his death in August of 1975. Dick Howitt, a friend of Coxie who succeeded him in the regional seat until the end of 1976, presented the ring to Mrs. Coxie.

Incumbent chairman Ric Morrow presented his predecessor Allan Masson with a ring. Masson was chairman from the inception of regional government to the end of 1976. Masson, in return, presented Morrow with a ring, as Morrow is retiring this year after two years as chairman.

Absent were George Harrington, Terry Mannell, Hill Mason, Paul Preston and Ted Raife.

Morrow said he had hoped the presentation of rings could have taken place in the region's new building. However, construction delays precluded this.

Nevertheless, he said, the occasion marked the last time regional council would officially meet in its rented Burlington offices.

The next meeting of council will be in Halton Manor in Milton Nov. 1 and the first meeting in the new building will be Nov. 15.

A portrait of Masson was unveiled by Morrow, to conclude the ceremonies. It will hang in the new headquarters.

A reception followed.
