Waples may hit million season

A little more than \$25,000 separates horseman Ron Waples from becoming the first driver on the Ontario Jockey Club circuit to hit the \$1 million mark in single season's purse earnings.

With four wins and two second place finishes in seven drives at Mohawk Raceway in Campbellville Sunday night, the Rockwood reinsman picked up \$10,324 in purse money (he finished fourth in the other drive) to lift the season's earnings for horses he's driven this year to \$974,471, leaving him just \$25,529 short of the plateau that's never been reached in the history of the Circuit. And he's got 41 nights of racing left to make it.

Three of Waples' four wins came in consecutive races the sixth, seventh and eighth - and he concluded the evening with his last of two second place finishes in the ninth

Waples' first win came in the opening race with Whitty's Ace, a 10-year-old pacer that hadn't won in the past two years but ambled home a four lengths winner for owner Cliff Burge of Miss-

After finishing fourth in the second race and second in the fifth with Valiant Ides, the 34year-old Waples connected with Rockway Fats, a threeyear-old pacer owned by Ron Haennel of St. Catharines (\$6.80); Good Better Best, a four-year-old he owns with the Grants Direct Stable of Toronto (\$6.00) and Demicup (\$11.00) for D. LeBlanc and R. Reyes of Toronto. Then came the second place finish

The four wins brought his season's win total on the Circuit to 232, providing him with a solid cushion over second placed Mel Corbett, who was winless on Sunday and has 193 wins. In the standings for the fall meeting Waples and Corbett tied with 44 wins apiece coming into Sunday night's action. Ron Feagan is in third place with 28 victories.

Waples last year became the first driver in racing history to drive the winners of over \$1 million in purses in a single season competing solely at Canadian tracks. He was also the first leamster to surpass the 300-win mark in a single campaign.



NAMES NOT ON POLLING LIST

Any person who has qualified to have his name entered on the polling list during the period of enumeration (September 4, 1978 to September 30, 1978) and finds that his name is not entered thereon or who has not filed the necessary forms to have his name entered during the period for corrections to such list (ending October 27th, 1978) can attend at my office to secure a certificate which will allow his name to be entered at the polling station. In addition to this, qualified electors may be entitled to have their name added to the list at the polling station on polling day.

Qualified Elector means: a person who during the period of September 4th, 1978 to September 30, 1978 was a Canadian citizen or other British subject, a resident of Milton or a non-resident owner or tenant or a spouse thereof and has attained the age of 18 years by November 13th, 1978.

PROXY VOTING

Forms are available at my office for the appointment of a voting proxy. A certificate to vote by proxy must be certified by THE CLERK. This can only be done between October 24th, 1978 and 5 p.m. Monday, November 13th, 1978.
