Martin Osso led the Redmen in scoring for both games. Against Perdue, Osso scored a total of 33 points. In the Burlington game he totaled 24. The closest member of the Acton team pointwise against Perdue was Glen Van Rijk with 13 points.

Defensively Rick McArthur, coach of the junior Redmen, pointed out Rob

Faber in the Perdue win and Van Rijk against Burlington.

Today (Wednesday) they host Lester B. Pearson from Burlington as they make their final preparations for the weekend. In the first game of the tournament at 9 a.m. Saturday the Redmen meet Winona.

Other teams entered in the tournament include Stayner, J.A. Turner, Bramalea, Saltfleet, Milton and Collingwood.

Games go on all day Saturday with the consolation final at 7.15 p.m. and the championship game at 8.30.

Hockey Mas' hold draw

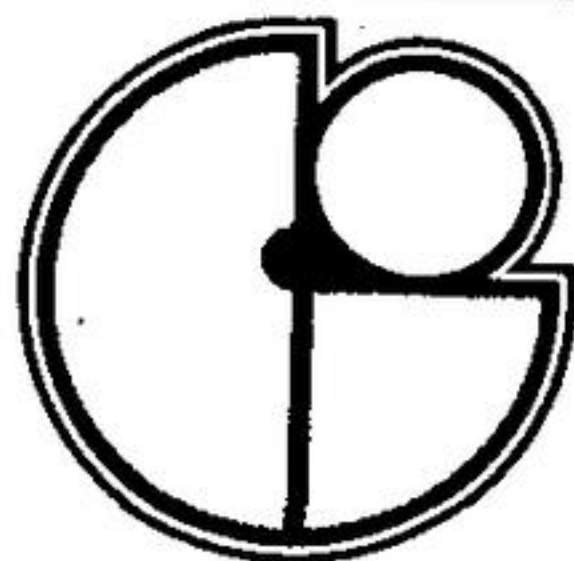
