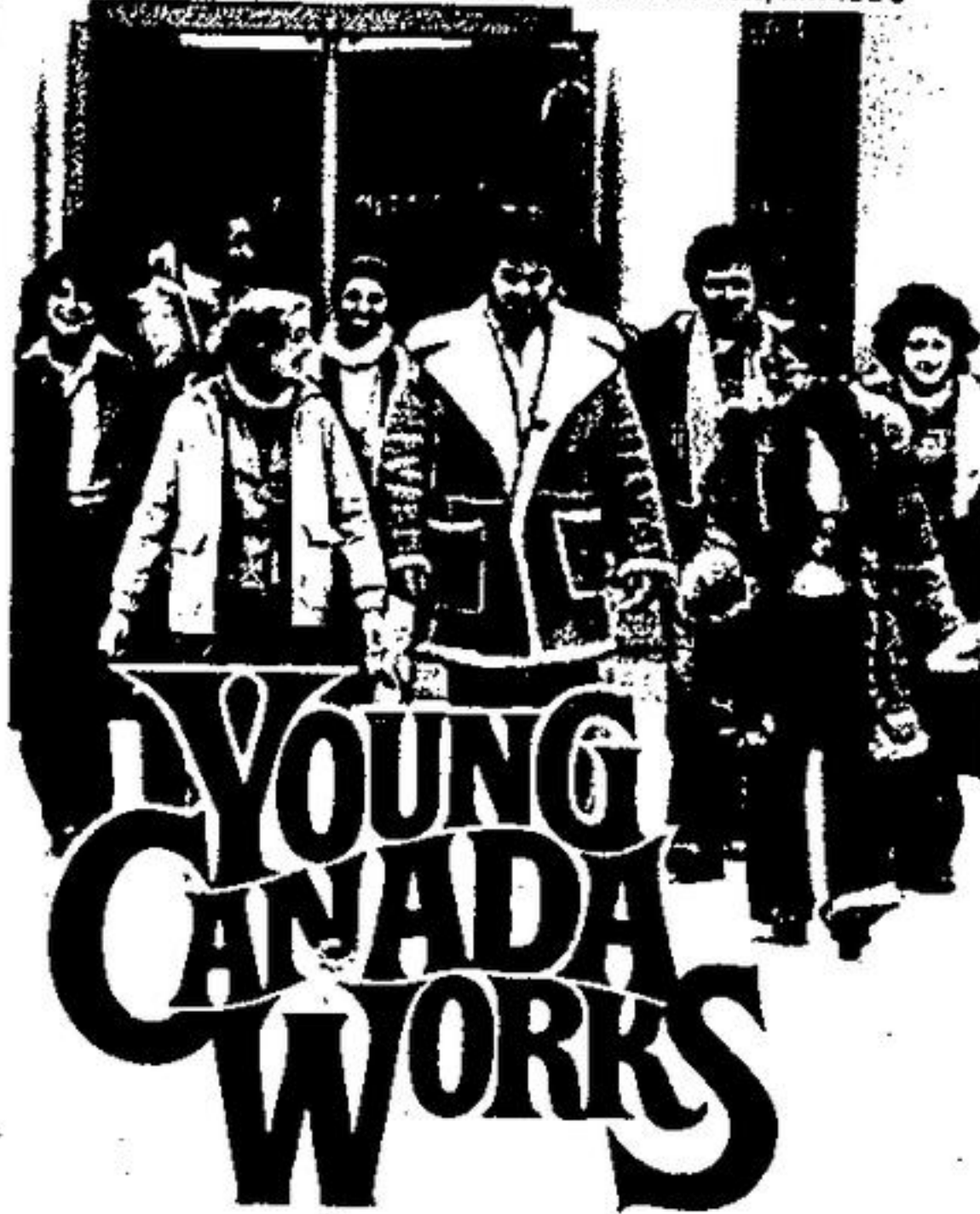

Mr. Pomeroy replaces former Mayor Tom Hill, who was defeated at the polls November 13. The new mayor not only fills Mr. Hill's empty seat on the commission but also on the commission's equipment committee.

Commission members, excepting the present mayor, have been frozen in their posts for the past several

years by a governmental ruling. They had all been previously elected in municipal elections.

Wilf McEarchern is the chairman, with Bob MacArthur and Orville Brown, Les Duby and Mr. Pomeroy as commissioners. The mayor has always been an ex-officio member.

Les Duby was mayor of Acton at the time of the last election involving the commission, thus his position is frozen on the board.
