

Lions top Georgetown split league encounters

Georgetown top novices

Acton Lions are currently in a battle for top honors in the Waterloo-Wellington league standings. They suffered a slight setback last week when they faltered against Orangeville 2-1 but topped Fergus 10-2. In an exhibition contest the Pee-wee pucksters topped cross town rival Georgetown major pee-wees 3-1.

The Lions loss came in Orangeville against the league's third place club. Acton scored first on a Brad MacPherson goal that stood up over the first two and one half periods but the Orangeville team rallied over the final five minutes to pull out

the win. The scoring was fairly well spread out in the 10-2 win over Fergus.

After a close first period, in which Acton found the marker only once, the Lions roared back with four second frame counters and five third period goals. Fergus connected one in each of the second and third periods.

David McKnight, Randy Coverdale, Jim Richard and Rick Dodds each scored twice for the Acton club with singles going to Steve Raine and Troy McNaught. Paul Cargill was the playmaker of the day netting three assists while Rick Dodds and Bruce

Canary added two each. Single helpers went to Stan Smith, Lorenzo Civiero, Brad MacPherson, Vince Danagher, Randy Coverdale and Jim Richard.

In a bit of a surprise the Lions topped Georgetown Majors 3-1. First period goals by Lorenzo Civiero from Stan Smith and Paul Cargill and Steve Raine from Smith and Civiero gave Acton a 2-0 lead before they allowed Georgetown their only marker of the day.

Stan Smith picked up his third assist of the game in the third period as David McKnight tipped in Smith's shot from the point.

The next game for the Lions Club pee-wees will be Saturday when they travel to Fergus for a rematch at 4.15 p.m.

Acton Alton-McIsaac Concrete Construction Novices dropped an exhibition match to Georgetown last week. The only Acton goal came off the stick of John Van Dam with Jason Henderson and Ian Johnston getting aids.

Firefighters top leaders

Acton Bantam Firefighters are currently in third place in the Waterloo-Wellington league standings but they are making a bid, after a slow start, to move up.

The Bantams took a pair of games last week to move them into a battle with Orangeville and Hespeler for the league title. The Firefighters topped Fergus 7-4 and shut-out league leading Orangeville 3-0.

A goal in each period did the trick for the Bantams in the Orangeville win. Andy Vavodas opened the scoring at the 8.38 mark of period one from Tony Sheppard and Tim Ferguson.

An unassisted goal by Rob Vermeulen in the second frame, and Mark Duval from Gord McArthur in the third, produced the final score.

Tim Baker "played well" according to coach Steve Marshall, recording the shut-out. "It was one of the best games the team has played all year," said Marshall.

Rob Vermeulen, Mark Duval, Rick Greenley and Tim Ferguson played strong games.

Firefighters found themselves behind the eight-ball early in the Fergus contest as they fell behind by two goals in the opening two minutes.

The Bantams pulled to within one at 3.10 of the opening frame as Tony Sheppard found the mark from Rob Vermeulen and

Rick Smith. The margin was short-lived, however, as Fergus came back just nine seconds later to regain the two goal lead. With under a minute remaining in the opening frame Mark Duval got the Acton attack moving with an unassisted goal.

Tim Ferguson tied the game at the 6.43 mark of the second frame Duval and Tim Evans. Evans put Acton in front for the first time in the game from Gord McArthur before the period had ended.

Rob Vermeulen gave Acton a two goal lead with an un-

assisted effort to start the final frame. Fergus picked one up before Gord McArthur found the twine from Tom Shannon and Tim Ferguson scored from Tony Sheppard.

Marshall was not happy with the team's defensive

play but felt his team had one of their better games passing the puck.

The next game for the Firefighters is Saturday when they play host to Fergus in a return match. Game time will be 5 p.m.

MESSAGE TO OWNERS OF Firestone STEEL BELTED RADIAL 500 AND TPC TIRES VOLUNTARY RECALL PROGRAM

Firestone Canada is participating in a voluntary recall and replacement of certain Steel Belted Radial 500 and TPC tires. If you have any of the tires described below on your automobile, you may be entitled to receive replacements.

Tires made in Canada or the United States are eligible and must have not less than 2/32nds treadwear remaining. To ensure your complete satisfaction, your local Firestone Store or dealer will be pleased to examine your tires and assist you in taking advantage of this program.

The following Firestone tires are being voluntarily recalled and will be replaced on a no-charge basis:

- STEEL BELTED RADIAL 500 (5-rib)**
purchased on or after September 1, 1975, and manufactured in the period from September 1, 1975 to December 31, 1976.
- NEW STEEL BELTED RADIAL 500 (7-rib) STEEL BELTED RADIAL TPC**
purchased on or after September 1, 1975, and manufactured in the period from September 1, 1975 to May 1, 1976.
- STEEL BELTED RADIAL 500 (5-rib) NEW STEEL BELTED RADIAL 500 (7-rib)**
purchased on or after September 1, 1975, and manufactured in the period from March 1, 1975 to August 31, 1975. Proof of vehicle purchase required for tires which were original equipment on a new automobile.
- STEEL BELTED RADIAL 500 (5-rib) NEW STEEL BELTED RADIAL 500 (7-rib) WITH PROOF OF PURCHASE ONLY**
purchased on or after September 1, 1975, and manufactured prior to March 1, 1975.
- STEEL BELTED RADIAL TPC WITH PROOF OF PURCHASE ONLY**
purchased on or after September 1, 1975, and manufactured prior to September 1, 1975.

The company will also refund any prorated adjustment price paid to Firestone on previously replaced tires now eligible for no-charge replacement, subject to presentation of adjustment invoice.

The following Firestone tires, although not recalled, will be replaced at 50 per cent of the regular retail selling price of the Firestone Store or dealer handling the transaction:

- STEEL BELTED RADIAL 500 (5-rib) NEW STEEL BELTED RADIAL 500 (7-rib) STEEL BELTED RADIAL TPC**
purchased before September 1, 1975, which are not covered by this recall.

NO CHARGE Mounting, Balancing, Valve
Owner-users qualifying for replacement tires will receive the new generation Firestone Steel Belted Radial 721 or TPC with no-charge mounting, wheel balancing and a new valve, if required.

PROOF OF PURCHASE
You will need tire sales slip or, in the case of original equipment, car purchase invoice.

RECALL PROCEDURE
If you are the owner-user of a vehicle with any of the above-listed tires, phone your nearest Firestone Store or dealer TO MAKE AN APPOINTMENT. Firestone Stores and dealers have a complete listing of serial numbers which indicate the date of manufacture for your tires. They will, from these numbers, determine if your tires are eligible for this recall.

EXPIRY
Claims must be registered within 60 days.

TIRE CARE
Air pressure of all tires must be checked frequently and maintained as recommended by manufacturers.
