'Shocking' increase pedestrian deaths

statistics for 1978 show "a road. shocking increase" in pedestrian fatalities, said Minister of Transportation and Communications James Snow.

Pedestrian deaths rose from 172 in the first nine months of 1977 to 193 in 1978, an increase of 12.2 per cent.

"I'm very concerned about this shocking inin pedestrian deaths," said Snow, "because it indicates both drivers and pedestrians are ignoring the rules of the road.

"The right-of-way for pedestrians or vehicles is governed by traffic laws, but it must be remembered that in every situation the right-of-way is something which is to be given, not taken."

Statistics last year point out that most pedestrians were killed while trying to cross through traffic, running onto the roadway or walking on


Pedestrians using a roadway should always walk facing traffic and light coloured wear pieces of clothing to make themselves more visible

"I urge parents to make sure their children know where and when to cross every road, and I remind pedestrians of all ages that a moving vehicle can't stop on a dime. As for drivers, be on the alert for pedestrians crossing the streets and most of all, be courteous," Snow concluded.
