

The Minister indicated he was pleased with the profit being made on Syncrude, and believed that the money can be used for other projects at a time Government have been revenues disappointing. For the past number of years the Government has been anxious to be seen as favoring private interests over more public involvement in Industry, and the sale of its share of the Syncrude project to a private Canadian-owned company furthers that

The Province bought into the project when it was in danger of failing due to the withdrawal of Atlantic Richfield Canada Ltd., a major private investor. At that time, total cost estimates had risen to \$2 billion from an original \$1.2 billion.

Last summer a former Minister of Energy had said, in an interview, that when he felt optimistic he thought the province's investment could worth up to \$140 million.

The last days of the session were quite hectic. A number of ministerial statements were made, and the House passed Bill 70, providing for comprehensive health and safety coverage of most workers in the Province.

Summing up the budget debate for his party, Ian Deans (NDP Wentworth) gave his last speech as a member. He plans to resign his seat soon, and will rejoin the Hamilton Fire Department, where he had worked prior to his first election to the Legislature in 1967.
