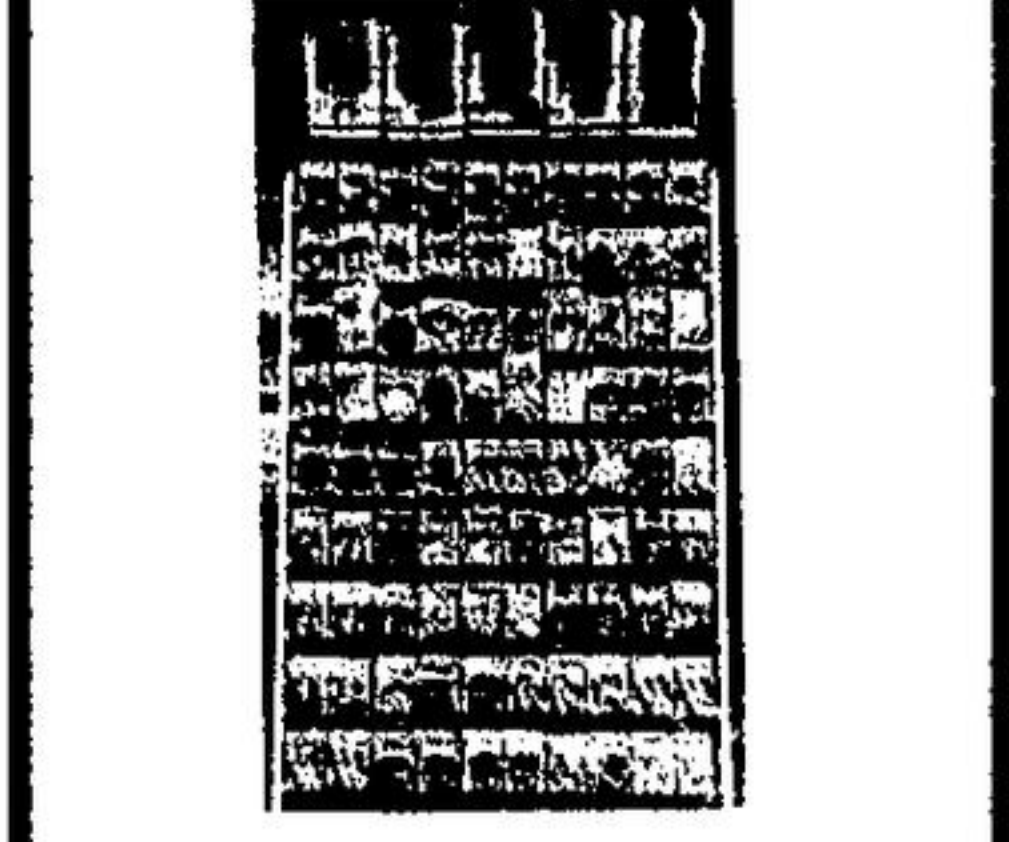
John Lambier
