CVCA ponders \$975,000 for studies, projects

The Executive Committee of the Credit Valley Conservation Authority recommended budget estimates of the Water Management Advisory Board be included in the overall 1979 budget to be considered by the Authority early in March.

A total of \$77,500, was recommended for surveys and studies to include the completion of floodplain mapping of the Credit River and Silver Mississauga Creek; mapping floodplain study; Orangeville floodplain mapping study; study; drainage

Ecologically Significant Area study; Metcalfe Ravine erosion control completion of design and Armstrong Avenue completion of preliminary engineering study in Georgetown.

New projects following preliminary engineering studies are: design engineering for Armstrong Avenue erosion control; design for erosion control at River Road in Huttonville; design for Erin drainage project; design for Glen Williams Paper Mill Dam project and for Inglewood Arena erosion control.

A total of \$898,200. is proposed for either new projects or completion of projects aircady underway at year-end.

These include channelization of Cooksville Creek - Atwater to C.N.R.; Eldorado Park in Brampton, erosion control Phase I and II; Fletcher's Creek erosion control; River Road erosion control; inglewood Arena erosion control; acquisition for land erosion control projects: Lornewood Creek water control; Metcalfe Ravine erosion control; Onelda Crescent erosion control: Shady Lawn Court ero-

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
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
