Consultants turn down Ballinafad subdivided lots

Erin Village has agreed on a preliminary study with Erin Township and the Ministry of Environment, on landfill sites. Township council will invite Bruce Creamer from the Ministry of Environment to a special mid-month meeting, to look into a five year study on garbage disposal, in hopes of obtaining guidance to establishing and operating a waste disposal site. The present site is licensed until 1980-81.

Drydon and Smith consultants replied about the request for eight lots instead of the former 17 in the proposed plan of subdivision in Ballinafad. This was a proposal to subdivide in stages instead of all at one time, which proposal had been refused. Drydon and Smith were not in favor, and did not feel the plan should be approved, as further growth would probably be proposed, and the subdivision is not in the intent of the Guelph and Suburban Planning Board.

Students Association of Canada has acquired the farm on Lot 18, Concession Three, from Jack Perry. Robert A. Nicholl and Phil Semenok of the Watchtower Bible and Tract Society, appeared before council to ask permission for a mobile home on the property for an interim period of one or two years while the Perrys are still living in the house. The 187 acre farm will be used as an educational complex for the bible students, and will be known as Watchtower Farm Canada. Beginning on a gradual basis they expect

up to 240 people when in full capacity, with livestock and 65 acres of orchard for their own use. They were in compliance with drawing up a Bond of Agreement on the period of use of the mobile home. Ed Stewart made application for an amendment to a by-law, to allow the erection of a building on Highway 24 at Brisbane, for an agricultural implement dealership on 4.7 acres of land. This building will have an upper storey over the showroom and parts department, and will be used for sales and service

of farm and utility equipment. Erin Township agreed to send building inspector John Salmon to the Ontario Building Officials Association, subject to Eramosa Township covering 50 per cent of the cost.

Erin Township is in need of a dog tax collector and advertisements will be placed. Applicants will be interviewed. A special meeting of the council will be held March 14, and the next regular meeting will be Mon., April 2, at 10 a.m.

New federal Child Tax Credit

Parents PLEASE READ THIS

You may be able to claim up to \$200 for each child in your family—depending on your family income.

If your family income is less than \$18 000 per year (that's the net income of both husband and wife) you will qualify for the full \$200 for each eligible child. If your family income is more than \$18 000 you may still qualify for a total or partial payment, depending on the number of children.

The application form for the new federal Child Tax Credit is enclosed with your

January family allowances cheque. Read the instructions carefully then fill in the form and send it along with your completed 1978 Income Tax Return and your statement of Family Allowances.

ATTENTION
If you need help, your nearest Health and Welfare or Revenue Canada Taxation office is there to assist you. Some private firms can also assist, but charges for tax discounting services can be as high as 15%. Try not to use them.
