Ontario Ombudsman Mr. Justice Donald R. Morand is following up on the investigation of the issuance of a Niagara Escarpment Commission (NEC) permit to Ontario Hydro. While waiting for a reply to his letter to Ontario Hydro chairman Robert Taylor, the Ombudsman has requested Housing Minister Claude Bennett reply to several observations about the minister's decision. The Housing Ministry was wrong in giving Ontario Hydro the development permit, according to the Ombudsman. The key issue was whether the NEC should pay attention to the policies of a member—Halton Hills. The town opposes construction of a 500kV Hydro transmission corridor through Halton Hills.

Up pay of rec. part time help

It took a lot of explanation and three weeks delay, but Halton Hills council finally accepted the proposed increased salaries for part-time summer help for the recreation department. Councillor Pat Patterson challenged a \$4 an hour rate for summer students of 16 years of age, but backed off when Mayor Pete Pomeroy explained the four dollar rate was not for the recreation department but for the engineering department, where students in engineering are hired. Recreation Director Glen Gray explained that the increase in many cases was simply the mandatory increase in the minimum wage. Councillor Russ Miller questioned the increase for the canteen manager from \$4.50 to \$5 an hour, but agreed after Gray explained there is one woman to look after the whole operation at both arenas, with the job covering developing a work schedule, taking inventory, ordering, and maintaining the canteens. Lifeguards in town pools will have a pay increase from a maximum of \$2.90 an hour to \$3.60. Miller said that was 12 per cent and asked why? The recreation director said the maximum is \$3.60 and the minimum \$3, with the rate paid depending on experience and level of aquatic skills. The change from a range of six dollars to \$15 for program instructors to a flat \$10 was accepted when Gray explained the fees charged pay for the programs. Councillor Ross Knechtel stated it didn't matter what the pay is—the program is on a break even basis and doesn't cost the taxpayer anything. Councillor Walter Biehn disputed this view, pointing out there was no reason the town could not make money on a program. Other wages approved by council include \$10 per half-day from ski bus supervisors up from \$8, \$3.60 for gymnastics coaches up from \$3.25, \$170 a week for summer program supervisors up from \$130 to \$140, and \$186 for assistant supervisors up from \$120. On the other hand, park attendants salaries were dropped from \$3.50 to \$3.75 to \$3 and hour.

The housing ministry's hearing officer dropped a major NEC condition, which triggered Halton Hills opposition, and cleared the way for the provincial utility to build towers on about eight miles of NEC land in Halton Hills. The Ombudsman also contends the hearing officer should not have expressed an opinion on the issue because the NEC lands are close to property which soon after was the subject of an Ontario Municipal Board hearing concerning the same hydro corridor. The NEC hearing was last June.
