Ten teams apply for Industrial loop

A smaller league and shorter season are just two of the changes contemplated as preparations begin for another Georgetown Industrial Football League season.

Commissioner Bryan Lewis, who is returning to the post for another year, said 10 teams applied for membership this coming season at an organizational meeting Thursday evening.

Peel Police, who played under the Park Toyota banner last year, have applied for a team as well as Acton, Limehouse, Rexway Towing, C and S Plumbing, Norval, DRG Stationery and Crichton Brothers Sports. Two other teams have also applied. Akers and Clarke Real Estate will be the new name for last year's champs, Georgetown Chrysler. Members of finalist Harley Motors will play under the Philp Publishing banner.

This year the season will start earlier, May 6, to avoid cold fall playoff games. Instead of 33 games the schedule will be trimmed to 27 matches.

Other changes being considered, Lewis said, are a designated runner and designated hitter to ensure more players get into each game.

Playing extra-innings to break ties is another new feature being reviewed as well as the idea of allowing four of 10 teams into the playoffs instead of eight of 12, like last year. It is felt fewer teams making the playoffs would mean a more competitive regular season.

Fees may be upped from \$35 last year to \$100 this season for each team. The entry fee would really be just \$50 with the other \$50 being a bond against defaults, a problem last summer. Teams would forfeit \$25 for each default. The third default would mean expulsion from the loop.

More team applications are invited and the 10 best will be selected Lewis said. He noted Hornby hasn't applied yet.
