

Allen stumps Cleaner shooters as Blow Press take first game

Up until Sunday night the only team that had beaten Family Cleaners in Acton Industrial Hockey League action was Van's Welding. Blow Press brought an abrupt end to that streak Sunday scoring a 3-2 win in the first game of the best of three league final.

Family finished the regular season with a 13 win, one loss and four tie record while Blow Press carried 12-2-4 credentials. The Cleaners needed three games to top Van's

Welding in semi-final play while the Pressmen had a rather easy time disposing of Acton Terminal Warehouse in straight games.

Dave Allen was the difference in the Sunday

contest as the Blow Press goaltender robbed Family shooters time and time again. "He stopped Ed on three break-aways" said one Family player, referring to Ed Hillier. Hillier had little

trouble beating the league's best goaltenders over the season accumulating 24 goals and 21 assists to win the league scoring championship by 12 points.

Allen stopped the initial shot on numerous occasions and then was there to make a second and third save when necessary.

George McPhail found the net behind Cleaners goaltender Mark Morrison with help from Bruce MacPherson.

Hillier got Family Cleaners on the board a short time later as he finally beat Allen with a high slap shot from just inside the blue line. Wayne Allan assisted on the play.

Each team took two penalties in the game. Game two of the final series is scheduled for the Community Centre on Sunday night at 7 p.m.
