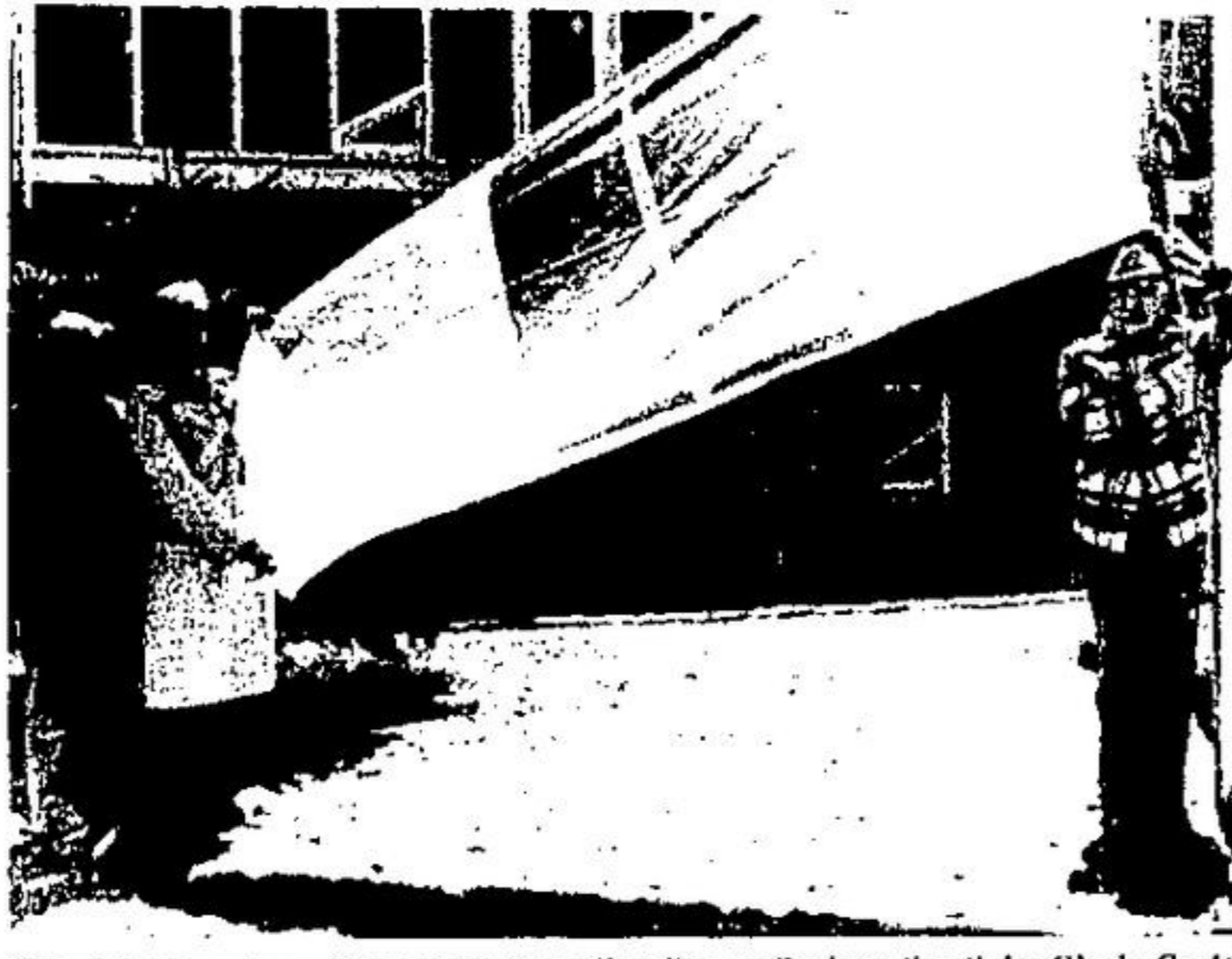

Full-time lawyer for legal clinic

Halton Hills Community Legal Clinic will have a full-time lawyer four days a week for the next six months.

The lawyer will be employed by the Mississauga clinic but be shared with Halton Hills for the six month's trial period. After that time if the work load here warrants it, the Ontario Legal Aid Plan will consider a full time staff lawyer for the Halton Hills clinic. If the work load does not prove a need for a full-time lawyer other options will be considered.
