Rockwood swimmer Allan Swanston has achieved another career goal—he's off to compete in the 1979 Pan American Games, held this year in Puerto Rico.

Am relay heats. Swanston says his goal is to outperform his own previous records to assure a berth in the finals. The 20-year-old faces a full schedule before the games get underway in July. He was also one of the eight men and four women Canadian Team selected to compete at the Coca Cola International Meet slated for Mid-April in London, England. The Canadian team is out for international experience and acceptance, and Australia is rumored to be the toughest competition, he says.

Swanston will attend the Pan Am training camp in the U.S., one week prior to the Games. It includes two hours waterwork before school, and two hours after classes. Weight lifting and flexibility exercises are part of his regimen three to four times per week.

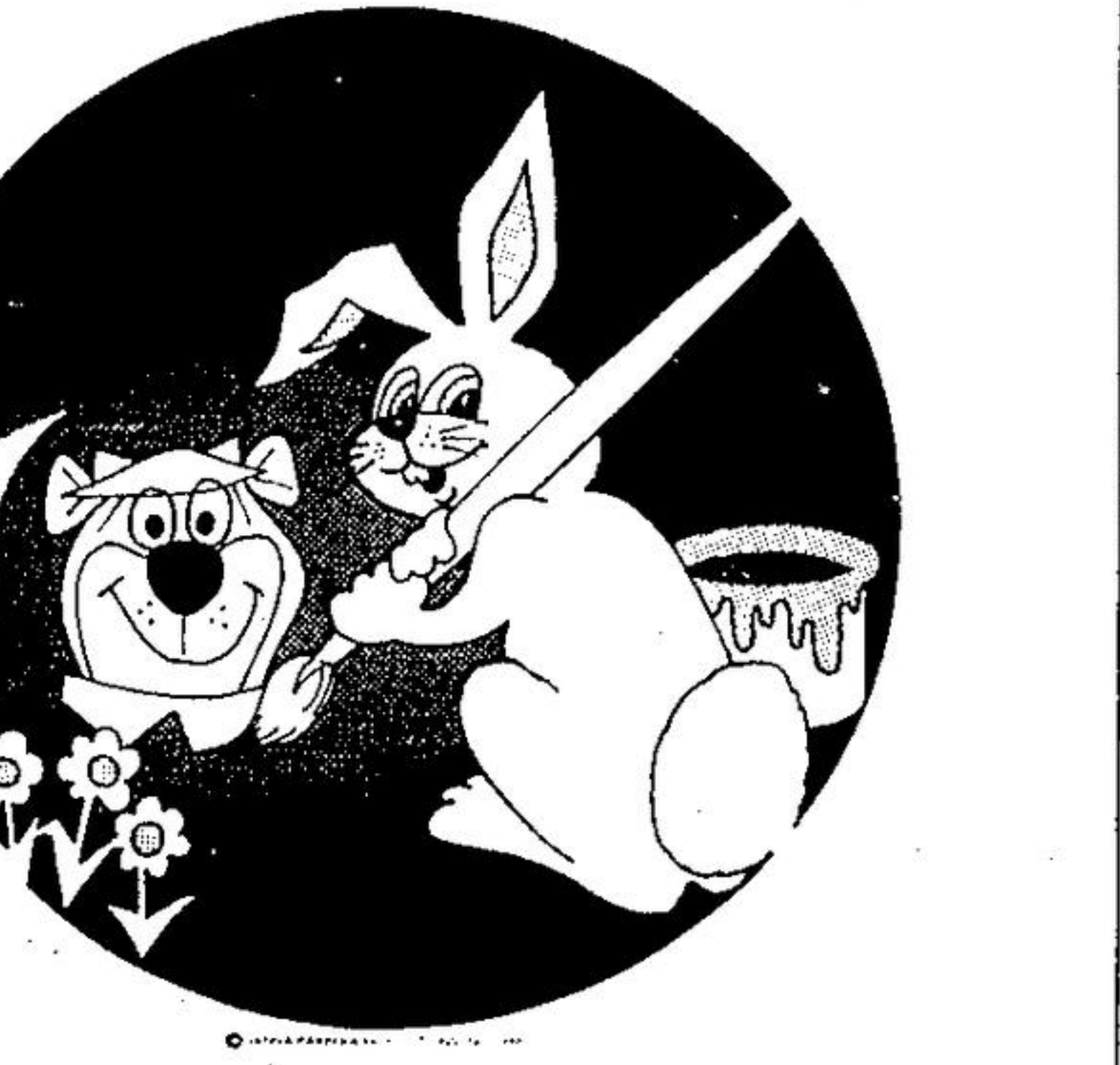
