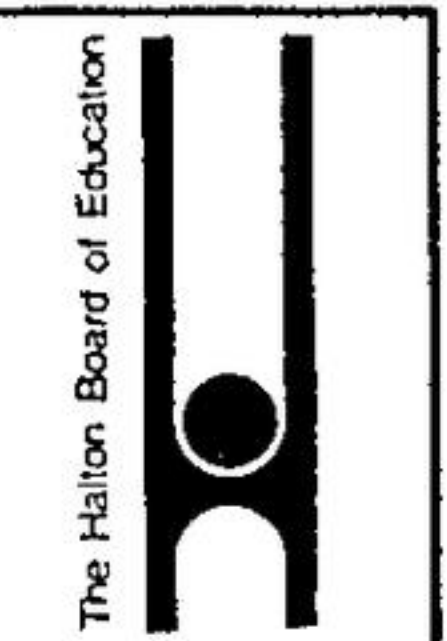
A Group project, a crocheted afghan with cross-stitched flower motif afghan was won by Mrs. E. Archibald.
