The local students held the trophy for raising the most money per capita in Ontario, two years running. It will not be known for some time if they will remain champs this year.

The dance-a-thon started at about 10 a.m. and ended about 10 p.m. with 179 students and teachers registered. Mike Ashley was dancing for the most money per hour with \$27.98 worth of pledges. Carol Waskauk, at \$11.19 and Beth Scott, with \$11.07 were the highest girls. Together the group was dancing for \$397 per hour.

Gama Sound, of Georgetown, a disc jockey group owned by Marty Glaude and Gary Tobin, donated their time for the ten hour dance. Georgetown Kinsmen were the other main sponsors.
