Volunteers sell bicycle licences

For the fourth consecutive year, bike licences can be renewed at the Halton Regional Police headquarters in Acton, on May 7.

The special day was set up in 1976 by Constable Tom Roduck in order that those who have bicycles, but who are unable to get to the municipal offices during business hours, can renew their licences.

Inflation is yet to hit the costs since 1976, with the price remaining at \$1. This price includes a license plate to be attached to the bicycle, and the name of the owner and the serial number are fed into computers at the Montreal Bicycle Guild.

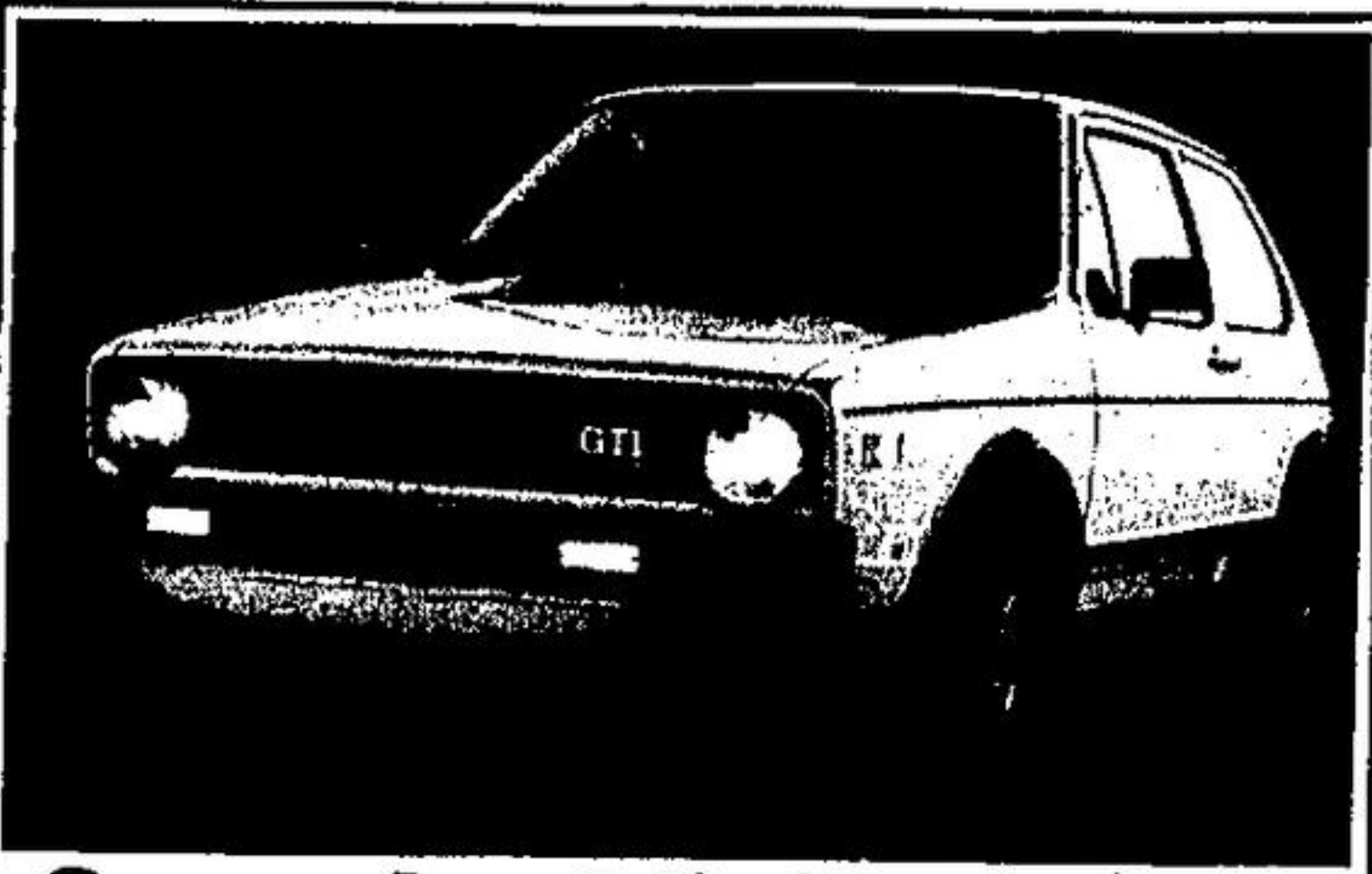

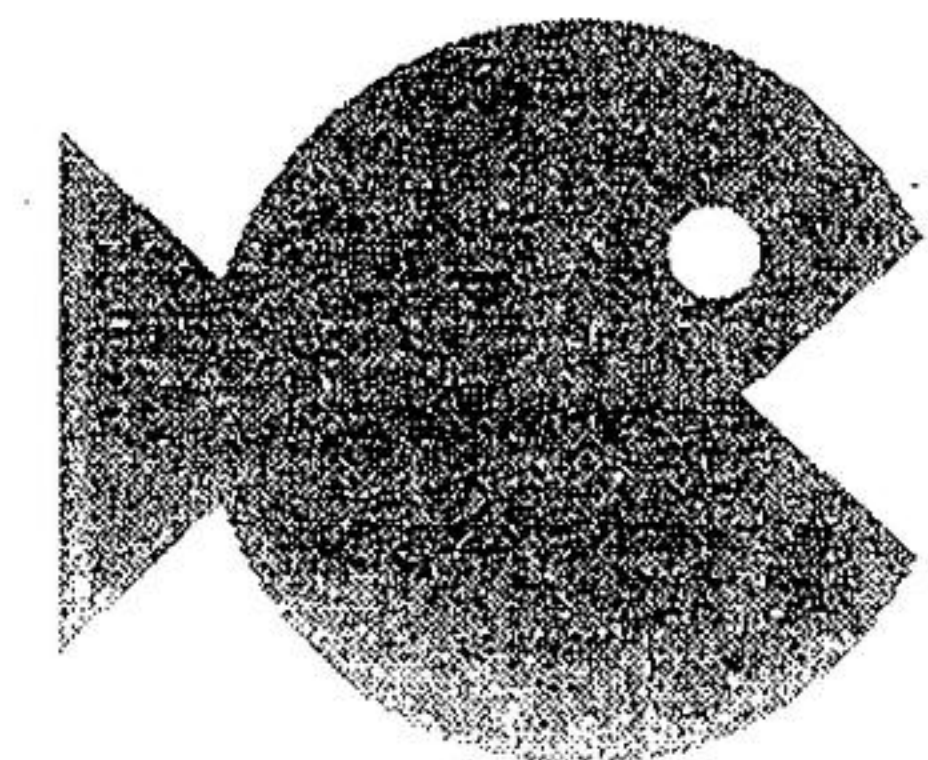

Two injured in Erin glider crash

Two people are in Orangeville hospital following a glider plane crash at the Erin Soaring Society, Tenth Line, Erin, Sunday afternoon. Brent Fenwick Turnwell, 40, Scarborough, the pilot of the craft, and his passenger, Ann Gillian Abraham, 31, Ajax, both sustained undetermined back injuries in the accident, according to Constable Murray Kidd, of the Guelph detachment of the Ontario Provincial Police.

The crash occurred, Const. Kidd told this newspaper, shortly after the vehicle took off, at 2:30 p.m. It was being towed by another vehicle, necessary for a glider to get off the ground, when the pilot decided to abort the takeoff. The plane crashed at the airport, striking trees as it landed.

Reason for the abortion is unknown until police speak with the pilot, Const. Kidd explained. Meanwhile, the Ministry of Transportation is investigating.

Police estimate damage to be between \$15-20,000 to the glider, which is owned by the Erin club. Const. Kidd doubts whether the craft can be salvaged. Parts of it may be used in other planes he said, but the crash almost totally destroyed it.
