Despite third place

Black happy in loss

NDP candidate Doug Black burst into his Oakville riding office full of optimism yesterday and remained in high spirits throughout the night, despite his third place finish in Halton riding.

was clearly the winner with 26,931 votes. Dr. Frank Philbrook, the Liberal candidate, had 16,620 with Black third at 7,327.

However, the 33-year-old successful lawyer was clearly not despondent. The NDP had done considerably better than in 1974 when the party tallied over 6,000 votes.

"Naturally, I am disappointed I didn't win and didn't do better. It's significant the people chose to support us on our issues. The Toronto Star supported us on our issues.

"We were able to eat into a lot of Liberal strength. Jelinek was able to hold his strength and did very well.

"I'm satisfied. I enjoyed it very much."

The crowd at the Galaxy Club on North Service Rd. seemed to share Black's high spirits since it appeared they expected the outcome.

Black's campaign manager Bob DeLeuw said earlier in the evening he was satisfied with the results, since by 9:30 p.m. he had already collected 14.9 per cent of the vote.

"I didn't know how the vote would go," admitted Black. "I've been through it before. I'm relaxed because I'm pleased with the campaign."

Black has experienced political defeat before. He lost his attempt to gain a provincial seat in 1977.

Political observers throughout the two months of campaigning agreed that Black had added a great deal of credibility to his party. He came out on top in many of the regional all-candidates' meetings.

"We expected a Tory minority," he said.

McDermid landslide PC sweep in Ontario

John McDermid, P.C. candidate in his first bid for public office, was elected in Brampton-Georgetown riding beating incumbent Liberal Ross Milne by more than 8,000 votes.

With 320 of 362 polls heard from at 10 p.m., McDermid polled 28,692 votes, Milne 20,973, and David Moulton, N.D.P. candidate 11,045.

In the Georgetown and District voting area, including the hamlets, McDermid racked up 5,810, Milne 3,482, Moulton 1,918.

In this area, Liberal Milne took only three polls, two at Wrigglesworth School,

one by 10 votes and the other by one vote, and won at Harrison School by 20.

Right from the beginning there was little doubt McDermid would take the Brampton-Georgetown seat, leading by 1500 votes only 45 minutes after the polls closed. The early lead continued all night in the Georgetown area as poll after poll was written on tote boards in all headquarters.

Halton depicts trend

Otto Jelinek, the new Member of Parliament for Halton, was the MP for High Park-Humber Valley in Toronto before redistribution carved the riding up and sent him to his Oakville home to seek re-election here.

Last night, the Conservative candidate in the riding of Parkdale-High Park, Yuri Shymko, lost the seat to the Liberal candidate, Jesse Flis.

Nationwide, the Liberal cabinet was nothing short of decimated as minister after minister went down to personal defeat.

Some were not totally unexpected. People like Energy Minister Alastair Gillespie in Etobicoke Centre, Secretary of State John Roberts in St. Paul's and Industry Minister Jack Horner in Crowfoot were not expected to win.

But there were surprises, too.

Veterans Affairs Minister Dan McDonald in Cardigan (P.E.I.) was expected to be re-elected. So, too, were Manpower Minister Bud Cullen in Sarnia, Transport Minister Otto Lang in Saskatoon East and Defence Minister Barney Danson in York North.

Preliminary returns indicated Indian Affairs Minister Hugh Faulkner lost in Peterborough, Labor Minister Martin O'Connell lost in Scarborough East, Multiculturalism Minister Norm Cafik lost in Ontario riding, and Small Business Minister Tony Abbott lost in Mississauga North.

Fitness Minister Iona Campagnola was reported in a neck-and-neck battle in her northern B.C. riding of Skeena.

The Conservatives, too, lost two of their bigger names, both in the Ottawa area. Jean Pigitt lost to Liberal Jean-Luc Pepin in Ottawa-Carleton and Robert de Cotret lost to John Evans in Ottawa Centre.

De Cotret was touted as a potential Finance Minister. It is ironic that Ottawa Centre was former Finance Minister John Turner's old riding.

Acton's newly-completed sewage treatment plant is one of the most modern in the region.

Completed in 1978, it rivals Milton's in sophistication, said Bob Moore, Halton Public Works director, during a regional public works committee tour of northern Halton facilities Wednesday, May 9.

It comprises primary, secondary and special treatments such as phosphorus removal and polishing.

The latter is spraying the effluent into the air and letting it sift through a gravel bed.

As in Milton's case, the effluent has to have sufficient quality because it is discharged into a small creek.
