Library looseleaf

Life and death at Gombe is the title of an engrossing article by Dr. Jane Goodall in the May issue of National Geographic. Dr. Goodall, who began studying Africa's chimpanzees in 1960, is horrified to find that some of the Gombe primates whom she has been observing and researching for 17 years are committing acts of violence not witnessed in her earlier studies. Warfare, terrorism and murder have been confirmed among Gombe chimpanzees, which would almost make one wonder of the primates were emulating mankind, whose own acts of violence against one another make grisly headlines.

Dr. Goodall explains why she and her helpers continue to observe the chimpanzees, whom she has found "to be more like humans than any other living creature. There is hope that knowledge of their ways and habits may help us to understand our own."

Later in the vividly illustrated article, she notes that recent years "have brought an increased public awareness of the horrors of human aggressive behavior and a growing fear of what a terrible fate this aggression may bring to the world. This concern in human society has led to an upsurge of interest in the aggressive behavior of non-human animals."

After reading Life and Death at Gombe one wonders—not for the first time—if the so-called thinking animal man has really climbed much higher up the tempest-tossed tree of civilization than Dr. Goodall's primates.
