A walk and a double closed the Acton lead to two runs in the bottom of the eighth inning and a single run in the ninth

produced a 6-5 final in Acton's favor. Belwood left a runner stranded at third in the final inning as Acton pitcher Kevin Archibald retired three batters in succession.

Acton coach Jamie Vickery was pleased with the four point win feeling his team had done a good job fielding. Vickery was displeased with the lack of hitting in the lineup following a 26-4 rout in their season opener in Elora.

A pair of singles and a walk were all the In-n-outers could get as they found tough pitching in the likes of Fergus' Mike Harper at Prospect Park Sunday afternoon. Parker gave up a walk in the third inning and

singles in the fourth and fifth in recording an easy 15-1 win for Fergus.

Paul Campbell was the only Acton player to cross the plate for Acton. The run came in the second inning as Campbell walked and then stole the rest of the bases giving Acton their one count.

Fergus scored twice in the first, three times in the second and then another pair in the third before playing two scoreless innings. Fergus added three runs in the sixth and another pair in the seventh bringing the final to 15-1.

Acton will be hoping to improve their home record Sunday at 1:30 p.m. at Prospect Park.

Recreation program expands

Halton Hills recreation department is making some changes and adding features to this summer's program.

This edition offers full day activities for youngsters and instead of children being mainly with their age group, they may mix with older or younger people this year.

There are to be three centres in Acton, each mainly devoted to one of the following themes: camp, sports and culture.

In all, there are three two-week long sessions at each centre. The starting dates are July 9, July 23 and August 7.

Prospect Park is the site for the camping groups. Each session includes a sleep-over at Blue Springs and parent's night based on that session's theme. Youngsters, seven years of age and older, are offered such activities as archery, canoeing, orienteering, nature study, camp craft, astrology and swimming. Carol Saxon of Trent University is Camp Supervisor. She is an Acton resident.

The price of the camp course is higher than that of the other two centres. However, each camp child receives a bus pass, according to Acton-Esquering recreation coordinator Jennifer Linton. Last year a bus service was also provided, and this year its going to the sport and to the culture centres too. Children at these other centres are to pay a ten-cent fare.

Kinesiology grad Melanie McCracken from the University of Waterloo is in charge of the Sports centre at Acton High School. Seven year olds and older may join.

MAD and sports participants may chose to register for a one week session rather than the two-week course, Miss Linton said.

Activities such as

swimming will not be confined to the sports centre. "It's going to be what the kids want," Miss Linton said. Drama people will be able to play some ball and go swimming, too, to break up the day, she said.

The adventure sites and playgrounds of previous years ran on half-days, but this year's three centres are to run all day.
